Dear GCHS Community,


It is hard to believe that this school year is almost finished! Attendance continues to be important as we make this final push through the month of May. Please encourage your students to finish the year strong!



The month of April has been testing month! We are very appreciative at how serious our students' took these assessments. Our attendance was very good, especially for our juniors who were taking the SAT college admittance test. There are still some times for makeup, but our initial attendance rates for assessing are as follows:

PSAT 10	10th Grade	94%	Closed
SAT	11th Grade	94%	Closed
CMAS (Science)	11th Grade	98%	Closed

Thank you parents for helping us to emphasize the importance of these assessments. The data from the PSAT assessments will help us determine the skill level of our students and to make instructional adjustments or interventions prior to students taking the SAT test as a junior. The SAT score is very important in determining college entrance and scholarship eligibility.

Important Reminders for Seniors

GRADUATION DAY: Remember, this is a formal ceremony so please dress accordingly. WEATHER PLAN: As NO SPIKED HEELS ALLOWED ON THE FIELD.

PICTURES AT COMMENCEMENT: Pictures may be taken during the Commencement ceremony. To prevent interference, no unauthorized individuals will be allowed on the field. A commercial photographer will take pictures of you receiving your diploma. You will be contacted about this after graduation, and you are under no obligation to buy these pictures.

IMMEDIATELY AFTER GRADUATION go to the Northridge High School cafeteria where you will receive your official diploma (you only receive the cover during the ceremony). You may keep your cap, tassel, and gown (unless you borrowed them).

always, we will continue the tradition of holding our ceremony outdoors. In the event of extremely inclement weather, we will move indoors to the Island Grove Event Center SATURDAY, MAY 27TH AT 8:30 AM. The decision to move to Island Grove will be made by Mr. Henson prior to the start of the ceremony and any changes will be posted immediately on the school website. Once the ceremony begins outside we will NOT utilize the inclement weather plan. We will run graduation to conclusion and if the weather conditions force the termination of the ceremony we will distribute diplomas in the cafeteria at Northridge High School.

FINANCIAL CLEARANCE: Before seniors can graduate, the following obligations MUST BE MET:

- Books turned in lost books and fines paid. All course and GCHS Library books turned in and Library fines must be paid.
- All past course fees must be paid.
- All athletic equipment turned in to coaches and all band uniforms, equipment, and music turned in to instructors.
- All other financial obligations for the past 4 years must be fulfilled. Remember, you will not receive your cap and gown until all fees have been paid. Please bring cash or check to cover all outstanding balances. We are able to take credit cards!
