A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Happy October! It is hard to believe that Fall is already here. Central has had a lot of firsts this year—our first ever virtual staff meeting in the Spring; our first ever July 31st graduation at District 6 Stadium; a first virtual townhall meeting with parents and families in the Fall. And thank you to all of the parents who attended our first ever virtual parent-teacher conferences! We will use the same set-up again on November 11th at our next conference date. Please plan to attend!



It has been a difficult start to a year in that we had no opening day assembly, no senior sunrise, no Homecoming parade or game or dance. And yet our students have been great—showing up the first day with masks on, cooperating with a pretty limited and locked-down schedule. They have done really well and are to be commended. The good news is that Football has returned to the Fall and our boys will be on the gridiron against Windsor beginning on Thursday, October 8th at 6:30pm!

Please know that teachers, counselors, and administrators are working quite hard to ensure that all students receive all of their credits during these first two quarters of the school year. With four classes each quarter for two quarters (0.5 credit per class), students will be able to earn 4 credits on their way to 22 for graduation. Student attendance is key as teachers are teaching quite a bit of content in short amounts of time. One trend we are noticing is that students are not logging in on their three days at home or, if they are, they are not completing the assignments. While we know this system is difficult to navigate, we need students and families to continue to persevere with us until the pandemic passes. Students should be in school, whether in-person or at home, 5 days a week and putting in the same number of hours at home as if they were in-person.

Parents, thank you for your continued support of the Wildcats and of your student(s) here. You are all a key ingredient to the success of the Castle. We appreciate those who volunteer extra time and attention to see that our students have a great high school experience. Thank you.

STUDENT SCHEDULES AND INFINITE CAMPUS PORTAL

Students should check their schedules on Infinite Campus as this will be the most accurate and up to date schedule available. There is an Infinite Campus mobile app for both students and parents. Instructions will be given out during our fall registration, on our website and also this newsletter (see flyers). You can also obtain the instructions and guide on the District website (www.greeleyschools.org) under the Families menu/Infinite Campus - Parent (or Student).

The apps are easily identified by a capital "S" for the student portal or a capital "P" for the parent portal. Students will login using their school username and their student number (lunch number) as their password. If a student does not know their login information, please see someone in the main office.





Parents who have accessed the parent portal last school year (at a District 6 school) should use the same username as before. This username would have ended with an **_PG** (underscore PG). If you cannot get logged in please call the Main Office at (970) 348-5000 for a password reset.



The event was held at the Armory Building on the campus of CU-Boulder and included Greeley High School, Fowler, Colorado Springs, Yuma, Gunnison and Pueblo Centennial. The Wildcats powered their way through the field to eventually beat Pueblo Centennial in overtime 22-20. The season, however, did not stop there. The Wildcats were then invited to attend the Intermountain Tournament in Salt Lake City, Utah and placed 3rd, defeating Missoula, Montana by a score of 41-28. They were, for the 2nd year in a row, considered one of the elite teams in the country. Cheers to old Greeley High!!

Welcome to the 2020-21 school year. What a year it has become with CHSAA changing the sports around into 4 seasons. We are currently half-way through the Fall season with boys golf, boys tennis, cross country and softball competing. In the upcoming weeks, off season programs will begin workouts with the hopes of their seasons in the future.

A few things to begin working on as the winter season (boys basketball, girls basketball, and wrestling) approaches on January 4th:

- 1. Registration is open on our website and we request students athletes register before the season starts
- 2. Maintain passing grades as students are required to pass all of their classes to remain eligible

Spectators at Events:

Just a reminder that CHSAA has limited fan participation this year and requires the use of masks at all events. Events in District 6 are also limited. PLEASE keep an eye out for our spectator guidelines concerning football, cheer and marching band. New guidelines are in the approval process as of October 1st.

SPORTS REGISTRATION

Mantenga al menos 6 pies (aproximadamente la longitud de 2 brazos) de distancia de otras personas.



Cúbrase con un pañuelo desechable la nariz y la boca al toser o estornudar, luego bótelo en la basura y lávese las manos.



Cuando esté en un lugar público, use una cubierta de tela para la cara sobre su nariz y boca.



Evite tocarse los ojos, la nariz y la boca.



Limpie y desinfecte los objetos y superficies que se tocan con frecuencia.



Quédese en casa cuando esté enfermo, excepto para recibir atención médica.



Lávese las manos frecuentemente con agua y jabón por al menos 20 segundos.



PICKING UP & DROPPING OFF STUDENTS - MAP

Please drop students off at the West entrance (student parking lot) in the morning for school. This parking lot is designed for a better flow of traffic. The Faculty parking lot (located on the North side of the building) is not designed for high-volume traffic and by trying to drop your student off at the North doors creates a bottle-neck on 15th Street and in the parking lot itself. The West entrance (student parking lot) creates a safer area for your student to get into the building rather than having them walk across 15th Street in traffic. Attendance for some testing or school events is delayed due to receiving final student attendance lists from the testing rooms or field trip chaperones/coaches.
