MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Merry Christmas from The Castle,

As we launch into the last three weeks of a tenuous two quarters that have included quarantines, extra days off for teacher preparation, temperature taking everyday, and now fully remote learning, I want to first acknowledge the gritty work of both students and staff. These last four months have been terribly difficult and unhealthy, to say the least, but everybody has worked hard and contributed to make good in a bad situation. I commend the



Wildcat family for their faithfulness and resilience in the face of difficult odds. But I especially want to acknowledge the courage that's been exemplified in sticking to this uncharted path—it's special grace, it's that special spirit in both student and staff that says, "Give me a challenge; I'll meet it with joy." Thank you all.

Courage is now important. We are being pulled into an unknown future in education, but part of that future is discovery—discovery of new ways of learning, new ways of connecting, new ways of growing. It's all part of taking a chance and expanding our own personal and professional horizons. The future is not doom and gloom—both are optional; both are a choice. 


PERFORMANCES WILL BE LIVESTREAMED AND TICKET COSTS DO APPLY!

NOTES FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Flu season is here:

The CDC recommends that everyone 6 months and older get vaccinated this season.

Here are some other tips for staying healthy:

- Wash your hands with soap and water frequently during the flu season.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Cover your mouth or tuck it into your elbow when coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid contact with people who are sick.
 Don't share drinks or utensils with others.
- Stay home with fever over 100.5, chills, head and body aches, or uncontrollable cough.

As we go remote: please help us continue contact tracing:

- Please notify your school's health office if your child becomes ill or receives notification of a positive COVID-19 test during the 48 hours after their last day at school. Voice messages will be monitored during the remote learning period.
- If your child has been out of school on a quarantine, please notify your school's health office if your child becomes ill or receives notification of a positive COVID-19 test at any point during the quarantine period.
- If your child tests positive for COVID-19 at any time during the remote learning period, please notify your school's health office.

Continue to practice recommended guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19:

• Wear a mask when around any person outside of your immediate household. Wear a mask both indoors and outdoors. Anyone 11 years of age and older is mandated to wear a mask in public places; anyone between the ages of 3 and 11 years are strongly advised to wear a mask.

- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for a minimum of 20 seconds scrubbing all surfaces
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash, or use your inner elbow or sleeve
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Stay home if you are sick. Please!
- Get a flu shot! Everyone in the household should be vaccinated against influenza. It is not too late! Flu shots are available through your healthcare provider and at numerous pharmacies throughout the community.
- Clean high touch surfaces in your home and personal items such as cell phones using regular household products
- Practice social distancing, staying at least 6 feet away from others
- Socialize only with those in your household; if you must attend a gathering, limit the number of people to 10 and only from two households.

- Fatigue
- Nausea, vomiting
- Diarrhea





SCHOOL SWITCHED TO REMOTE LEARNING

Greeley Central was able to stay in-person using our hybrid schedule through November 4th. Unfortunately, Central had to switch to remote learning starting November 5th at least through Thanksgiving break. About a week after Central went remote, the District also made the decision to switch the rest of the District to remote learning through the end of Semester 1. With regards to our schedule, we will still follow the Group A/Group B days, along with the Wednesday All Online schedule. The only change will be that students will not actually be "*In-Person*" at the school on our "*In-Person*" days. Students will attend their classes the same as if they were "*In-Person*", only remote online.

PLEASE NOTE SCHEDULE FOR DECEMBER:

There have been a few modifications to our school schedule for the end of December so please take a look at these changes. Quarter 2 & Semester 1 will end on Thursday, December 17th. Since we are limited to the number of "*In-Person*" days for students in November (due to Thanksgiving break), **PLEASE DO NOT MISS** any days after our Thanksgiving break. Any day your student is not attending class (either "*In-Person*" or virtually) could put your student far enough behind in school work to change a their grade from an "A" to a "C" or a "C" to an "F". 

Tales from the Archives

The 1980 Northern Conference Champion Cats!

During the 1979-80 school year, the Wildcat boys basketball team brought back an old tradition to Greeley Central by returning to the state tournament again. In total, it was Central's 25th appearance in the prestigious state dance. Tournament play came to an abrupt end, however, as the cats suffered an unfortunate 50-47 loss to the Regis Raiders in the qualifying round. This was after the Wildcats captured a share of the Northern Conference Title. At that time, a birth to the state tournament was determined by the outcome of the conference tournament, which found the Northern Conference filled with tough competition. Coach Hicks was in his second year at the helm of the program and the Cats managed victories in the tournament over Poudre, Greeley West and Niwot. This was 2 years after leading the cats to an 0-18 campaign. After establishing a 7

game winning streak earlier in conference play, the Central cagers suffered a 77-75 loss to Rocky Mountain in an overtime battle to end the season; however, with wins over Poudre and Centaurus, the Cats were guaranteed a share of the regular season crown. Tad Boyle went on to be named All Northern Conference for the 2nd year in a row and was recognized as MVP of the Northern Conference while being selected to the Denver Post and Rocky Mountain News All State Teams.




