## **A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL**

Dear Wildcat Students and their Parents/Guardians,

It is difficult to believe that we are already four weeks into the second semester; I hope yours is going well. If not, as of the this writing, there are 334 more days left in the year to change it. There's a saying, "Most people overestimate what they can do in a day but underestimate what they can achieve in a year." I've been challenged to think in my journal what I want to be saying about my year in December 2021.

I continue to marvel at the grace and perseverance of our students. They survived yet another semester (Fall) and have begun a Spring semester first fully remote and now in a hybrid model and to think, there was no practice for this.

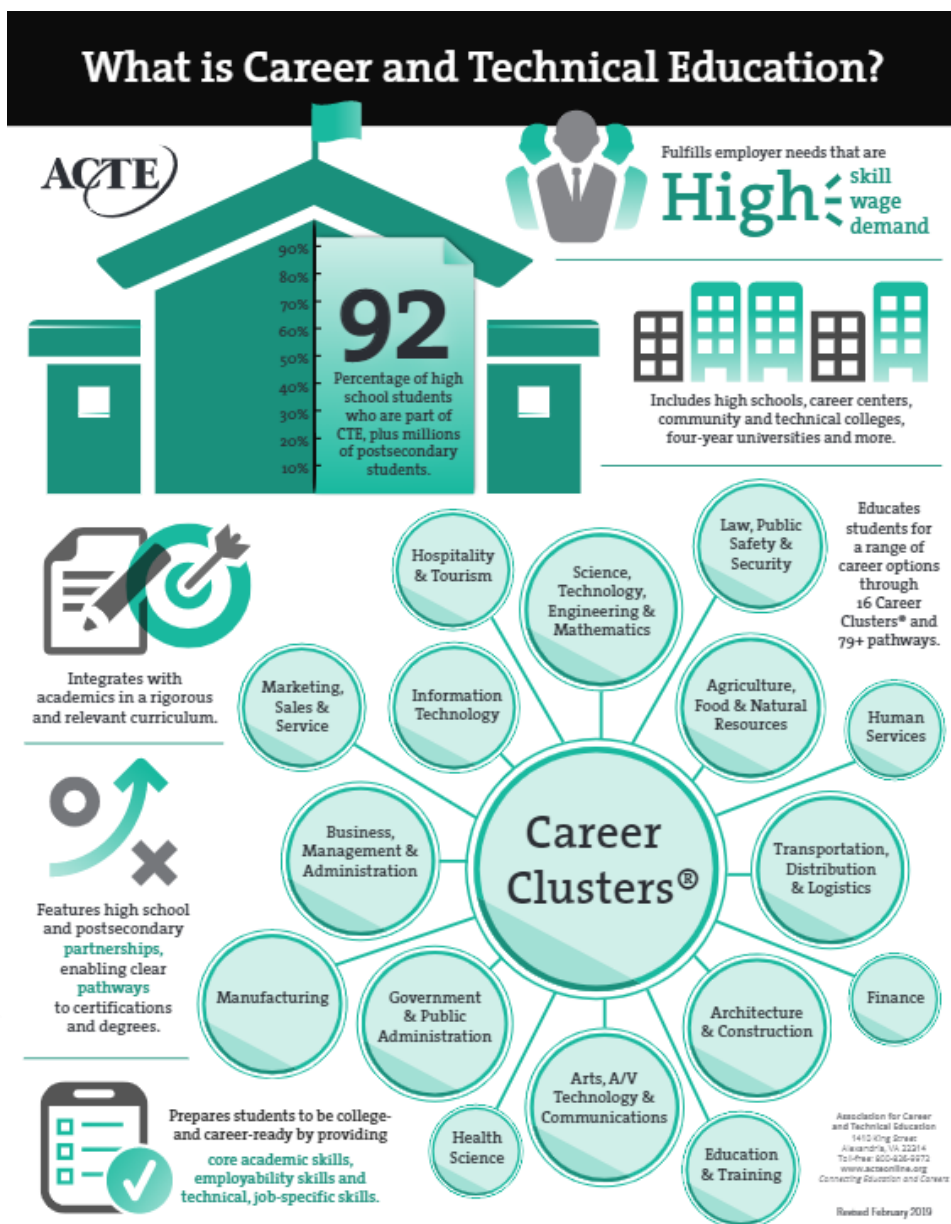

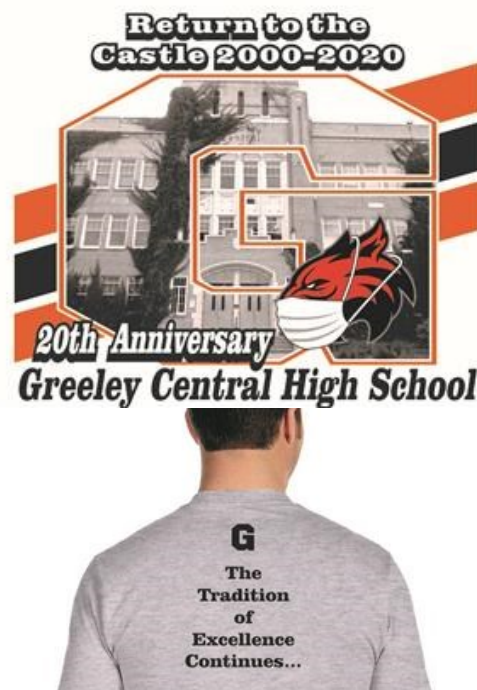

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## **NOTES FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE**

### **Flu season is here:**

The CDC recommends that everyone 6 months and older get vaccinated this season.

Here are some other tips for staying healthy:

- Wash your hands with soap and water frequently during the flu season.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Cover your mouth or tuck it into your elbow when coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid contact with people who are sick. Don't share drinks or utensils with others.
- Stay home with fever over 100.5, chills, head and body aches, or uncontrollable cough.

### **As we go remote: please help us continue contact tracing:**

- Please notify your school's health office if your child becomes ill or receives notification of a positive COVID-19 test during the 48 hours after their last day at school. Voice messages will be monitored during the remote learning period.
- If your child has been out of school on a quarantine, please notify your school's health office if your child becomes ill or receives notification of a positive COVID-19 test at any point during the quarantine period.
- If your child tests positive for COVID-19 at any time during the remote learning period, please notify your school's health office.

### **Continue to practice recommended guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19:**

- Wear a mask when around any person outside of your immediate household. Wear a mask both indoors and outdoors. Anyone 11 years of age and older is mandated to wear a mask in public places; anyone between the ages of 3 and 11 years are strongly advised to wear a mask.

- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for a minimum of 20 seconds scrubbing all surfaces
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash, or use your inner elbow or sleeve
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Stay home if you are sick. Please!
- Get a flu shot! Everyone in the household should be vaccinated against influenza. It is not too late! Flu shots are available through your healthcare provider and at numerous pharmacies throughout the community.
- Clean high touch surfaces in your home and personal items such as cell phones using regular household products
- Practice social distancing, staying at least 6 feet away from others
- Socialize only with those in your household; if you must attend a gathering, limit the number of people to 10 and only from two households.

February is "I Love My Future" month! The College Center will be pulling seniors out of seminar to complete college applications, FAFSA (bring 2019 tax forms), Bright Futures, and more!

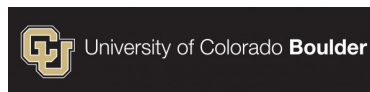

Welcome to the Greeley Central Athletics/Activities corner. Check out what we have coming up, what we've done, and even archives of some of our highlights from years-past. We spot-lighted the girls team from 1980-81 last month, so here's a spot-light for the boys team from 1980-81 (this from the 1981 SPUD).

### Tales from the Archives (from the 1981 SPUD)

#### "Cats earn first perfect league season since 1967"

During the 1980-81 school year, for the first time since 1967, the Wildcat cagers were undefeated in conference play with an 11-0 record. The pre-season was very successful also, gaining six wins against one loss, a heartbreaker to Golden, 64-62.

Two games marked the drive toward the undefeated season. The Cats beat a strong Fort Collins team, 63-56, on the Lambkin court. A little later in the season, the Longmont Trojans came to Greeley, hoping to gain a share of the conference lead. The Wildcats put a stop to any ideas of upsets, holding the Trojans to 47 points compared to the Cats' 58.

During the Longmont game, Gary Cruz of Denver's Channel 9 and his cameraman taped a feature on Tad Boyle. The Cats demolished Niwot, 79-46 in the final game of the regular season to grab the conference title. For the third year in a row, Tad Boyle was a unanimous choice for the All-Conference Team. Honorable Mention recognition went to Jay Branham and Dean Miller.

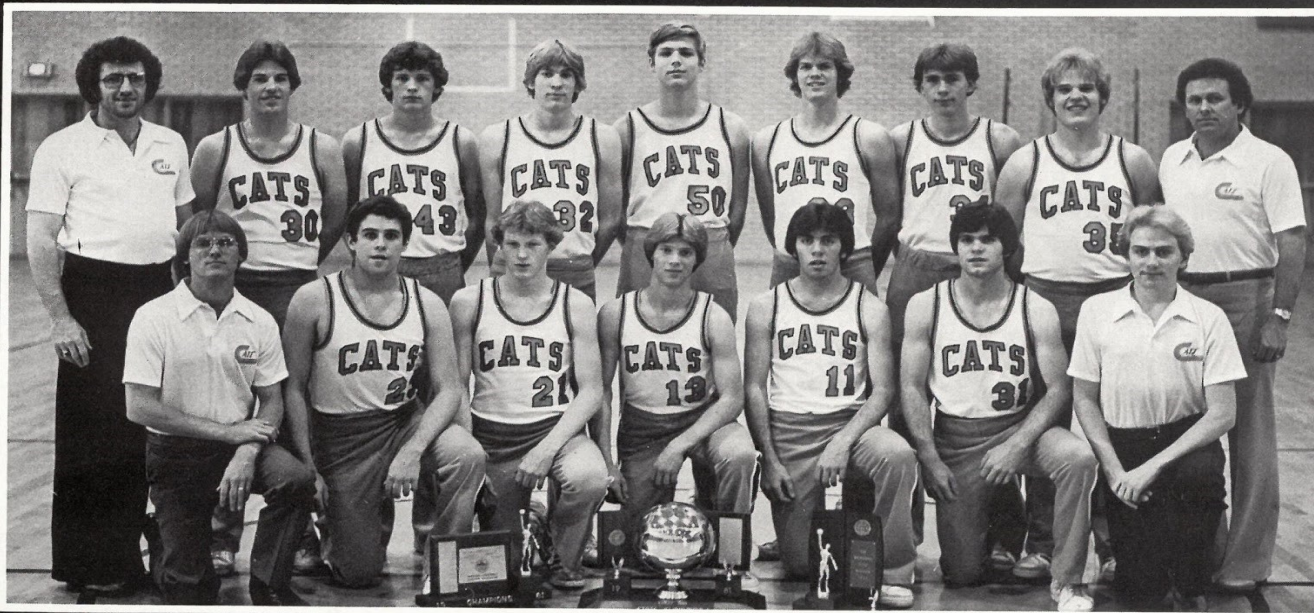

### Cats capture AAA crown and 11-0 league season

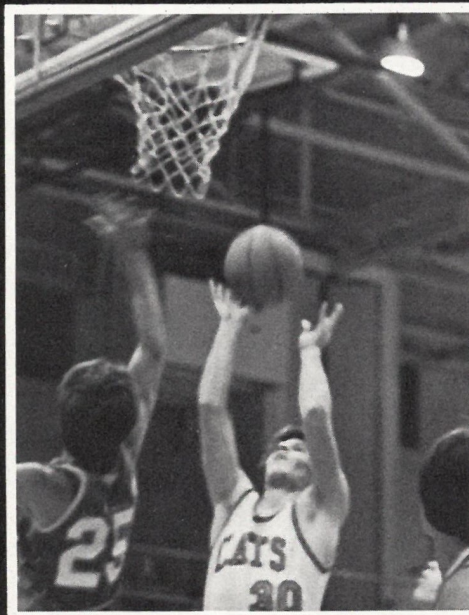
Central's cagers completed one of the finest seasons in the school's history by winning the AAA State Championship at the Colorado University Events Center. The Cats made it to the tournament by compiling an overall season record of 19-1, and an unblemished 11-0 league record. The Cats made it through the Conference Tournament by first defeating Skyline in a game in which they trailed 55-50 with three minutes remaining.

Central pulled out with some game-ending heroics and won 64-57. The Cats moved on to the tournament finals at Butler Hancock Hall where they easily defeated Niwot, 67-55, to claim the tournament title and the number one seed to the State Tournament from the AAA Northern Conference schools. In the first round of the state meet, the Cats faced Mullen. The Mustangs tried some slow-down tactics to stop the Wildcats, but to no avail as the Cats came away with a 33-19 victory. In semifinal action, the Cats faced Canon City, a team they faced early in the season and defeated, 105-63. This game was much closer. Junior Dean Miller sank a fifteen foot jumper with two seconds remaining to give the Cats a 57-55 victory. With a near capacity crowd on hand, Broomfield and Central did battle for the championship.

After a close first half, the Cats pulled away for a 70-43 rout of the Eagles. This was the first state cage championship for the Cats since 1962.

Tad Boyle and Dean Miller were named to the All Tournament Team. Boyle also received the Jim Baggot Most Valuable Player Award at the Northern Conference Tournament for the second year in a row.

### An Update from the Activities Director's Desk

Hello Wildcat athletes and families,

And we're off! The 2020-21 winter season started on Wednesday 1/27 as the Greeley Central girls basketball team took on the #1 Bulldogs from University High while the boys travelled to take on the Trojans of Aurora Central. Our wrestling team hosted our first quad of the season and all in front of no fans due to COVID restrictions. With that said, District 6 is committed to getting families in the doors for our home contests beginning in February. When approval for fans is granted, we will follow the listed guidelines and procedures.

#### Home Contest guidelines and expectations:

- Please plan on arriving no earlier than 20 minutes before the start of the event
- Masks/face coverings are required to be worn at all times
- A voucher is required to purchase a ticket into the event. If a person does not possess a voucher at the ticket table, they will not be allowed to purchase entry into the event.
- To allow for social distancing, please find a white dot on the bleachers to sit at. The seating has been designed to have 2 seats together spaced out every 6 ft.
- Home fans (other than cross town rivalry games) are only permitted
- No more than 50 fans will be allowed in attendance in the main gym
