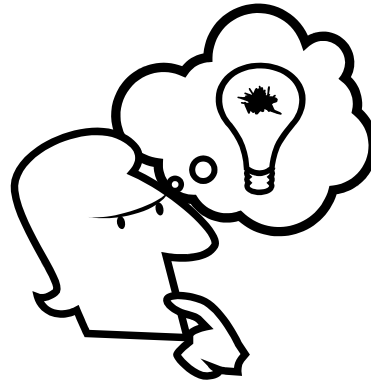


CLASSROOM RULES

WHAT IS AVID AGAIN?

AVID is a program that prepares students for four-year college eligibility. AVID is a class that is taken every year as an elective to help you learn what it takes in and out of the classroom to be successful in rigorous courses. We do this by helping you embrace the elements of WICOR: Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading. This involves taking good notes and reflecting upon those notes at a higher-level than you may have ever done before. The class also guides you through college, major, and career selection, the college application process, ACT/SAT preparation, and will help you find scholarships. It is also a privilege to be a part of AVID at Greeley West. Violating your AVID contract CAN result in removal from the program.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THIS CLASS

AVID OBJECTIVES/ GOALS

It is imperative that AVID students must share the following goals and objectives for this class:

1. Academic success in college preparatory courses (including AP and IB classes)
2. Increase GPA and standardized test scores (CSAP, ACT, SAT, etc)
3. Successful completion of college eligibility requirements.
4. Enrollment in four-year college or university after high school education.



HOW TO SUCCEED IN AVID

ATTENDANCE POLICY

GRADING

This class operates on a weighted system of grading... meaning each assignment is NOT equal.

Tutorial Requests/Reflections	40%
Assignments/Projects/Final	20%

Please turn your assignments in on time. Late assignments can only be turned in within the week, and will only count for 50 percent.

Major projects will be given a due date in advance and are not typical assignments. Therefore, such projects will be due before an excused absence and cannot be turned in late. No extra credit will be offered. The grading scale for the year:

FINALS WEEK

There WILL be an AVID final that will test you on your ability to use the learning strategies acquired during the class. You also will do a five-minute presentation outlining how you have studied for your other class finals.

TUTORIALS/STUDY TABLES
