A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Wildcat Families.

We had a fantastic start to 2024 here at the Castle! Last semester, we sent messages home and made numerous announcements regarding updates to three of our procedures: IDs, cell phones/headphones, and bathrooms. All of these procedure updates are intended to increase our student engagement in the classroom and continue to improve our safety and security. And our students and staff are rockin' it! Here is a brief summary of each updated procedure:

- **Student IDs:** Students are required to wear their 23-24 student IDs. Security and administrators are checking IDs upon entry through the West Entryway (the only student entrance). If students do not have their ID, we will print them a sticker ID for the day. Students can purchase a new ID for \$5 in the main office.
 - **How it's going:** Students are doing an amazing job! Our first day had a long line for printing the stickers but the rest of the week has gone very smoothly and the line is very short.
 - **How you can help!** If your student is struggling to remember their ID, please help them come up with a routine at home to remember their ID each day.
- **Cell phones/headphones:** We expect all students to put up their cell phones and headphones at the start of each class. Please check out the full expectation and next steps here.
 - **How it's going:** Most of our classes already had a similar procedure so it has been pretty seamless as we work on being consistent across the school.
 - **How you can help!** If you need to get in contact with your student during class, please contact the main office at 970-348-5000 and we will get you in contact with them.
- **Bathrooms:** Bathrooms are closed the first and last part of each class period. This helps us with getting students to class in a timely manner and with creating more opportunities for bathroom supervision. If a student must use the bathroom during this time, their teacher will contact the main office. We will of course honor 504 and health plans.
 - **How it's going:** We are working on our supervision to ensure our bathrooms are clean and our students feel comfortable using them.
 - **How you can help!** Please contact us if you have any questions or concerns!

ATHLETIC/ACTIVITY ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

Please note the weekly eligibility guidelines:

- 1. Students in grades 9-12 are required to meet the eligibility standards set by the Colorado High School Activities Association (CHSAA) of passing at least five (5) academic classes in the semester prior to participation begins, when the cocurricular activity is one which is governed by CHSAA.
- 2. Weekly eligibility is done throughout the school year & will be the determining factor for FULL participation in an activity each week. Grades will be pulled on Thursdays & students informed of their status. Students will have until 3:00pm on the following Monday (or other specific time given by the Athletic/Activities Office) to address failing grades for eligibility purposes. The following are the weekly high school eligibility requirements:



- All students must be enrolled in a minimum of 5 full-time classes. A student enrolled in only 5 classes must be passing (D or better) ALL classes.
- A student enrolled in more than 5 classes may be failing 1 course & still be eligible to participate (i.e., enrolled in 6, fail 1; enrolled in 7, fail one; enrolled in 8, fail 1).
- A student enrolled in more than 5 classes **becomes INELIGIBLE** if they fail 2 or more classes (i.e., enrolled in 6, fail 2 or more; enrolled in 7, fail 2 or more; enrolled in 8, fail 2 or more).

AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING/SATURDAY SCHOOL

Does your student need a little extra help with some classes? Does your student need to catch a on a class or two? There are plenty of opportunities to get that extra help. Not only do we have Seminar two days a week (95 minutes on each of those days), we offer after school tutoring as well as Saturday school.

After school tutoring is held after school (go figure) **Tuesdays through Thursdays from 3:45pm to 5:00pm.** Teachers take attendance for those that take advantage of this opportunity. There are some days where we may need to cancel after-school tutoring based upon teacher conflicts, meetings, or other events. UDENT SCHEDULES AND INFINITE CAMPUS PORTAL

Students should check their Semester 2 schedules on Infinite Campus as this will be the most accurate and up to date schedule available. There is an Infinite Campus mobile app for both students and parents. Instructions were given out during our fall registration, on our website and also this newsletter (see flyer links below). You can also obtain the instructions and guide on the District website (www.greeleyschools.org) under the Families

menu/Infinite Campus - Parent (or Student) (or click these links - English / Spanish).

The apps are easily identified by a capital "S" for the student portal or a capital "P" for the parent portal. The District Name is "Greeley 6". Students will login using their school username and their student number (lunch number) as their password. If a student does not know their login information, please see someone in the main office.





Parents who have accessed the parent portal last school year (at a District 6 school) should use the same username as before. This username would have ended with an _PG (underscore PG). If you cannot get logged in please call the Main Office at (970) 348-5000 for a password reset.


CHECKING FOR STUDENT FEES, SCHEDULES & GRADES

As we finish semester 1, please start checking to see if your student may owe any school fees

(ESPECIALLY IF YOU ARE EXPECTING TO **GRADUATE IN THE SPRING OF 2024).** Please check Infinite Campus (either through the Student portal or the Parent portal) to view these outstanding items. To view these items, once logged in to Infinite Campus:

- For Outstanding Fees, at the top left of the screen, click the menu icon (see the left red arrow in the picture to the right).
- Click the menu item labeled "Fees" (see the red circle in the picture to the right).
 - The default shows all "Unpaid" fees. If your student currently has fees due they will show up here.
 - To see what fees have been paid during this school year you can change the "Type" at the top right to "Paid". To view all fees incurred (paid & unpaid) for this school year, change the "Type" at the top right to "All".
- To pay outstanding fees, please utilize the District 6 Web Store, which can be located under the main picture of our school website or by clicking this link.
- For Final Grades/Report Cards, click the menu item labeled "Documents". The default year shows 23-24.
 - To view your student's report card for semester 1, click "Report Card SM1".

OM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Let us introduce ourselves!

Carvn Ishmael is our Greelev Central High School Registered Nurse Consultant and Tina Alvarez is the Health Clerk.

The Health Clerk is in the Health Office every day between 8am and 4pm. The School Registered Nurse is responsible for several schools in the district, but is available by appointment most days.

The Health Office phone number is 970.348.5026. The school fax is 970.348.5030.

In District 6, the **Health Clerk (Tina Alvarez)** is the person you will most often speak with when contacting the Health Office. Tina has received training in basic first aid skills, CPR, medication administration, immunization requirements, vision and hearing screening and some specialized medical procedures. She works under the School Registered Nurse's professional license. The School Registered Nurse (Caryn Ishmael) is responsible for all activities which happen in the health office, including, but not limited to, training and supervising school staff to care for students with health or medical concerns at school and on field trips, writing health care plans, working with health care providers to obtain the necessary orders and obtaining health histories for students with Individual Education Programs (IEPs). Caryn also monitors student attendance, communicable disease patterns and provides or assists with student health • education.

MEDICATIONS:

Reminder! Any medications administered at school must have health care provider orders and a plan for administration. This includes inhalers, EpiPens, cold medicine, pain relievers, cough drops, special ointments or lotions, etc. If you have a medication your student needs to take at school, please contact the Health Office and we can help get the correct paperwork completed. Please help us take the best care of your student by updating any health questionnaires, health care plans or other health documents that come home with your student or via the email that you gave to the school. We update all student information annually and would love to chat with you about any health concerns your student has. You can always email the School's Registered Nurse, Caryn Ishmael

Health is an important part of every student's education. Healthy students make better learners. The Health Office team is here to support your student's health care needs and help them stay healthy,



safe and present in school so they are ready to learn. If your student has a health concern, is ill, or you need health resources or a health care provider, the Health Office team can help! Give us a call!

FLU SEASON IS APPROACHING

Here are some tips for staying healthy and preventing the spread of illnesses:

- Get your flu shot! The flu vaccine is recommended by the CDC for everyone 6 months and older.
- Stay home when you are sick. When exhibiting illness symptoms such as fever over 100.4, chills, head and body aches, or uncontrollable cough- stay home to prevent others from catching your illness! It is also important to avoid close contact with people who are sick. Your child must be fever free without medications and no longer presenting with vomiting & diarrhea for at least 24 hours to attend school.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Germs spread this way. Don't share drinks or utensils with others.
- Cover coughs and sneezes. Use a tissue to cover coughs and sneezes, then dispose of the tissue. When a tissue is not available, cough or sneeze into your elbow.
- Wash hands for 20 seconds with soap and warm water. If you cannot wash your hands, use alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces or objects. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill.
- Consult your primary care provider with any symptoms of significant illness. The doctor will speak with you about possible treatment options. Provide a doctor's note to the school if your child will be absent due to illness.



ING LOT LOOP NORTH SIDE PROCEDURES

In an effort to keep our students and community safe, we are asking that you look at this map and discuss it with your student.

Green Arrows

Vehicles traveling west on 15th street cannot cross over the center line to access the parking

Orange Arrows

- Vehicles traveling east on 15th street should enter at the first entrance to the parking lot, travel around the outside and upon exiting, take a right turn and continue east on 15th street.
- Please review the parking lot arrows for appropriate travel throughout the day. They

match the angled spaces and keep all in the lot safe.

White Arrow

January 2024

- The Crosswalk is for pedestrians crossing. There is another crosswalk at the light east of the school. Please only cross at these two points.

Please be aware that there are times when the office staff are short-staffed or we do not have staff or students available to send passes to your student when given no notice ahead of time. Most appointments scheduled for your student are setup by you, the parent/guardian, long before the time of the appointment. Please don't wait until the last minute to call in for your student to be released from school. Your student:

- May be taking an exam in a different classroom than normally scheduled;
- May be in a P.E. class that is on a run around the school or on our practice field;
- May be in a meeting with a counselor, administrator or other staff member;
- May be on a field trip;
- May be in their Seminar class (Tuesdays/Thursdays from 2pm-3:40pm). During this class, students travel from one teacher to another and locating your student in a short period of time may be tough or impossible to do;
- May be in a club meeting or an impromptu rehearsal;
- May be skipping their current class (I know, that would never happen with your student (2)) and we are unable to locate your student in a timely manner.



Although students are typically found in their normal classes, you can see from all that may occur in our high school that a student may be difficult to locate. We do our best to track down your student for their appointments, but please take into consideration the fact that we need a little more notice than just a few minutes to get your student for you.

Although we have just started the school year, we have already seen an overwhelming amount of phone calls for not only attendance issues but early releases for students at the last minute. We ask for your patience as we try to handle your phone calls throughout the day. If your appointment or early release is in the afternoon, PLEASE CALL IN THE MORNING so we can prepare a pass for your student and allow us to track down your student throughout the day. We will give your student their pass and they just need to show their teacher the pass, in which the pass will show the time of their checkout. We understand there are emergencies that do occur and we do our best to accommodate for these situations.

School ends at 3:40pm EACH DAY. Releases AFTER 3:00pm may not be possible.

PLEASE PLAN AHEAD! CALL ATTENDANCE DIRECTLY: (970) 348-5014.



All students that are released for appointments will be sent to the **WEST STUDENT PARKING LOT** (see map on previous page) to be picked up, unless there are special circumstances. All students must use the **WEST ENTRANCE** when they are dropped off and return to school.

When students are late to school or are returning to school from an appointment, student should enter through the West Entrance and head to the Attendance Office to get a pass to class. If the student was at a doctor/dentist appointment, you can send that doctor/dentist note with the student and the Attendance Office will completely excuse that absence without the parent having to call the student in. While the doctor/dentist note may not be required, **by providing the** doctor/dentist note, your student's absence will not count towards their 80 single period absence count (remember, a parent/guarding can call in to excuse a student's absence up to 80 single period absences within a school year without needing a note, unless on truancy or on an attendance contract).

Extra security measures have been put into place this school year with our North and West Vestibules. If you have an appointment with someone in the Main Office, Counseling Office, or with a Teacher, please make sure to have a **VALID** government issued **ID** with you. All visitors will be scanned through our Raptor system and a valid government issued ID is required. These measures have been put in place to not only protect your children, but also to protect our staff.



TARDY POLICY

In an effort to get students to class in a timely manner and attend their classes, GCHS has reinstated our tardy policy which began in January of 2023. If a student receives more than three tardies or unexcused absences in a single week, they will receive a detention for each tardy after the first three and 2 detentions for each unexcused absence.

Examples:

- If a student is tardy to 4 class periods with 0 unexcused absences they will receive one detention
- If a student has 5 unexcused absences they will receive 4 detentions because 5-3=2 and they receive 2 detentions for unexcused absences.
- If a student has 2 tardies and 2 unexcused absences they would receive 2 detentions because 4-3= 1 and unexcused absences receive 2 detentions.

Tardies and unexcused absences will be pulled weekly on Fridays after school and students will receive their detentions to serve the following week. Students that are habitually tardy or absent will receive greater consequences leading up to suspension.

If a student feels that they were not absent or tardy to a specific class, the student will need to speak with the teacher in which that tardy/absence was given. If there is a correction to be made, the teacher would either write a note for the student to give to the Attendance Office or the teacher will email the Attendance Office directly and get the tardy/absence in question cleared.

The best way to make sure there is no confusion and that the student does not get a detention is to be on time to class and not skip classes without an excused absence.







MESSAGE ABOUT TESTING

Throughout the year, we assess students on a variety of standardized tests. Some are for the student, like the ASVAB and SAT, where the results directly impact their post-graduate plans. Some tests are for the student AND school, like CMAS and (P)SAT, to ensure that we are providing access to grade level work. Some are more often administered for grade level data dives, like the NWEA. This series of tests progresses through all grades, and allows teachers to see where a student is



performing, learn about possible gaps in knowledge and determine how to best address them. Teachers utilize all tests for growth of students, no matter how long the data takes to return to the school. In this day and age of technology, it is how many things are assessed. From fortune 500 companies to sports, data drives growth, and is an integral component of our education system. We encourage you to sit and discuss the importance of testing with your child, and know that we are very excited for all students to do their best so we can show them, and Greeley Central High School, in the best light possible.

On January 23rd, we will begin WIDA/ACCESS testing for students who know a 2nd language. This test helps determine language development of English learners. A student MAY test out of this assessment if he/she levels up, so if your child is a 2nd language learner and hasn't tested out of WIDA, PLEASE encourage him/her to do his/her best! WIDA consists of 4 tests that will be administered over a day-and-a-half and measures Reading, Listening, Speaking and Writing in the English language.

This year, our school has been chosen to give the NAEP (National Assessment of Educational Progress). This assessment includes 50 randomly chosen Seniors and will test in either Reading or Math. The NAEP test will take place on January 30th. If your child has been chosen, we will notify you mid-January.

And - Juniors are gearing up to take their state required SAT assessment in April. To prepare, all Juniors will practice during Seminar using Khan Academy. Khan Academy has proven to be a great resource for preparing students for high stakes testing such as the SAT. Please ask your child to show you his/her progress! Thank you for supporting your children, it is our pleasure to educate them!





















HALL OF FAME: PETE D'AMATO

(FOOTBALL, BASKETBALL, BASEBALL COACH 1943-1969)












HALL OF FAME: 1951 FOOTBALL TEAM












HALL OF FAME: 1957 BASEBALL TEAM














HALL OF FAME: DALE THOMPSON

(BASEBALL, BASKETBALL, FOOTBALL, GOLF COACH 1952-1982)












HALL OF FAME: FRANK CARBAJAL

BASKETBALL, BASEBALL 1953-1956













HALL OF FAME: LARRY HOFFNER

BASKETBALL, FOOTBALL 1953-1956)












HALL OF FAME: HARRY HINZELMAN (TENNIS, BASKETBALL 1957-1960)












HALL OF FAME: KONNIE MACKEY

(BASKETBALL, GYMNASTICS, TRACK & FIELD 1977-1980




