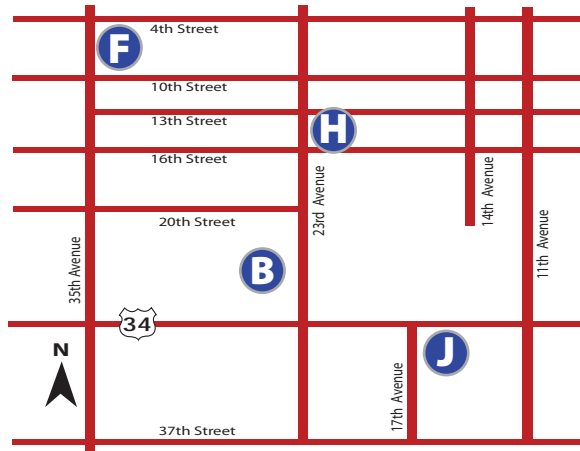

academics

Advanced Programming: All middle schools have opportunities for advanced programming through individualized Advanced Learning Plans. Services are also available for students identified as Gifted and Talented.

AVID: Advancement Via Individual Determination is geared to engage students on a path toward college. AVID includes challenging coursework, tutoring, study skills support and strategies to help improve academic performance.

Career Pathways: Eighth graders have an opportunity to explore some of our high school career pathways, including health science, engineering and the International Baccalaureate.

Core Curriculum: All students receive the highest-quality instruction in math, language arts, social studies and science. Support courses are offered in math and reading.

Electives and Exploratory Classes: Students can choose from a variety of special courses, including band, choir and/or orchestra, art, technology, international languages and physical education. Extended day programs are also available at some schools.

Advising: All students meet with an advisement teacher on a weekly basis. Advisors help students stay organized, check grades, learn behavioral expectations and stay connected with a caring adult.

Athletics: Every school offers team and individual sports at all grade levels. Offerings include football, volleyball, basketball, wrestling, swimming, cross country and track. Through a partnership with the City of Greeley, students compete with other middle school students in Greeley and Evans.

Student Council: Leadership skills are honed in student government. Each school has student representatives to help plan events and engage in discussion about school policies.

National Junior Honor Society: NJHS honors those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of scholarship, leadership, service and character. In addition to recognizing students for their accomplishments, NJHS also challenges them to be involved in school activities and community service.

Co-curricular Clubs: These vary from school-to-school, but can include League of United Latin American Citizens, forensics, drama, Builder's Club and music clubs.

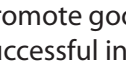

PBIS: All middle schools use the Positive Behavior Instruction and Support Model to promote good behavior. This program has been successful in teaching conflict resolution and controlled response to issues that may arise in school.

Safety: Staff and administrators receive continuing training on dealing with bullying issues. All middle schools have full-time campus monitors and access to school resource officers.
