War of 1812

- The United States declared war on Great Britain on June 18, 1812 because of long simmering disputes.
- The Central dispute surrounded the impressments of American soldiers by the British.
- The Marines fought bravely in several famous battles including the Battle of Bladensburg outside of Washington, DC and the Battle of New Orleans.



Growth of the Marine Corps

- In the period between 1815 and 1836, the United States did not engage in any foreign wars.
- Lieutenant Colonel Franklin Wharton, commandant from 1804 to 1818, focused on improving the disciplinary system, and improving health and living conditions in Marine quarters.

5th Commandant



- Served in the USMC for 53 years
 - > 2nd Lt. June 4, 1806
 - > 1st Lt. March 6, 1807
 - Capt. April 1, 1811
 - ➤ Maj. 1814
- Record for length of service as CMC
 - > 17 Oct 1820 6 Jan 1859
 - > 38 Years, 2 months, 19 days
- Lt. Colonel Brigadier General
- "Grand Old Man of the Marine Corps"
- "Force in Readiness"




Mexican War 1846 - 1848

- Marines acted as a decoy for the Army.
- One day battle
- Blood stripe
- Marines Hymn "from the Halls of Montezuma to the shores of Tripoli"

Civil War


- 1861 country found itself in an entirely different situation.
- 30% of the MC Officers resigned to fight for the south.
- These were dark days for the U.S.



1st Medal of Honor

Today In USMC History

15 May 1862: Corporal John Mackie, the first Marine to earn the Medal of Honor, was commended for service in the USS GALENA during action against **Confederate shore batteries** at Drewry's Bluff which



blocked the James River approaches to Richmond.





Marine Corps Emblem

- In 1868 the EGA was adopted.
- Eagle / Globe / Anchor
- Modified in 1950 (the addition of the rope)
- The emblem is what we wear today.







Marine Corps Motto

 8th Commandant, Charles C. McCawley officially adopted the Marine Corps Motto.
