HIGH SCHOOL PLANNING TIMELINE



- November 1st: Open enrollment window opens!
- November: Discuss High School choices with your family.
- December 15th: Open enrollment window closes. All applications submitted after this date are automatically wait listed.
- February 2023: Open Enrollment lotteries run and offers sent via email and text message.
 - Begin ICAP: Explore how interests and careers relate.
 - High Schools come to Bella for registration.
 - Specialized Programs begin accepting applications.
 - February 28: Parent deadline to accept offers
- Early March 2023: Attend registration open house at your high school

BOUNDARY HIGH SCHOOL

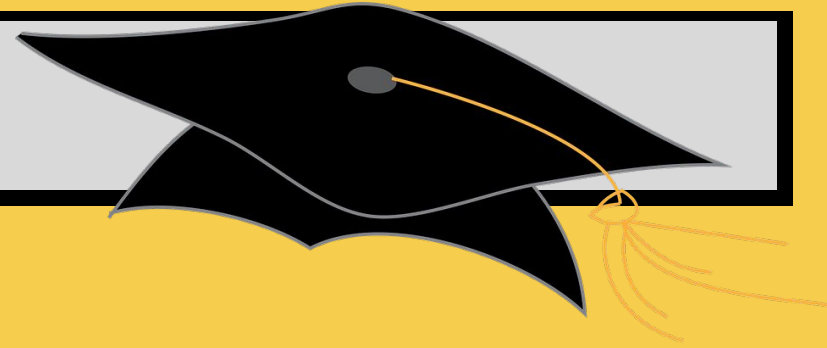


- Determined by the primary address assigned in Infinite Campus. Will have to provide proof of residence.
- Most students choose to attend their boundary school
- Transportation (bus) may be provided
- No further action required to attend
- Cannot be waitlisted or denied entry



- Determined by an application submitted to attend a school outside of primary address boundaries.
- An avenue to opportunities provided at one school, but not another.
- Transportation not provided.
- Could be waitlisted or denied entry.

ALL HIGH SCHOOLS OFFER



- Honors classes
- AP (Advanced Placement) classes
- Dual Enrollment and Concurrent Enrollment classes
 - These classes are college level/credit classes that can be taken while in high school and can help save money on college tuition
- Certificate programs
- Unique Career Pathways

HONORS CLASSES

- More challenging than “regular” high school classes.
- Offered to Freshmen and Sophomores in English, Social Studies, and Science.
- Can be a good stepping stone to AP classes.
- All require recommendation from your 8th grade teachers during the registration process.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) CLASSES

- More challenging high school classes that offer you the opportunity (by taking a test) to receive credit in college for taking this class in high school.
- More than 20 are offered in a variety of subjects from English, Math, Science & Social Studies to Art, Music & Foreign Languages.
- AP Human Geography is available to freshmen

AP CLASSES VS. IB PROGRAM

Advanced Placement

- Courses may be selected on an individual basis
- Designed to be as challenging as a college-level course
- Must take a comprehensive test in the subject area to receive college credit
- All colleges accept (or not) AP credits differently. Check with admission departments for their requirements.
- \$96 per exam

International Baccalaureate

- Enrolled in full program where majority of courses are IB
- Designed to be as challenging as a college-level course
- Must take a comprehensive test in the subject area to receive college credit
- All colleges accept (or not) IB credits differently. Check with admission departments for their requirements.
- \$130 per exam

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT CLASSES

- Courses offered at Colorado colleges and universities.
- Juniors and seniors may take up to 6 credit hours per semester.
- Students work with their counselors to make sure they have the ability to take these courses off campus inside the school day.
- They earn both college and high school credit for these classes and the state pays for them if students perform well.

Typically these courses take place at AIMS or UNC.

DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES

Dual enrollment courses are AIMS Community College or University of Northern Colorado courses that allow students to earn college credit in their high school building rather than attending on- campus. This provides another opportunity for students who may not be able to travel to campus.

The Beginnings of a Plan

WHAT IS ICAP?

An Individual Career & Academic Plan (ICAP)

- Required for all students grades 6-12 in Colorado schools
- Helps create a plan for high school & beyond
- Based on individual skills, abilities, and interests

NEXT STEPS

STEP 1: Check your address in Infinite Campus. If a two-household family, check both and who is listed as primary. That is how boundary school is decided. Update with the front office if needed. Proof of residency will be required.

STEP 2: Have a conversation as a family. It's important to know the following:

- What are your child's goals for their future?
- What are their special passions, interests, and abilities
- What special circumstances exist in your family that may impact this
- life change?

NEXT STEPS CONT.

STEP 3: After you discuss as a family, **compare the answers to the programs we discussed tonight.** If your child's goals can be achieved at their boundary high school, there is nothing to do right now.

- These next steps and program options are out on a table for you to take home

STEP 4: If you even remotely suspect your child's goals would best be met by their attending a high school that is **NOT** your boundary high school, **submit an application for Open Enrollment** sometime between November 1 and December 15. It is far better to decline an offer you decide you don't need that end up on a waitlist you may never come off.

- Offers sent out the first week in February and must be accepted by February 28, 2023.

STEP 5: **Start looking at admissions requirements** of schools your child is interested in. If a 4-year college/university is in their future you may begin to plan while they attend high school.
