Greeley Central High School has over a century-long history of outstanding individual and group accomplishments and performances in the fine arts. One historic photo shows the 1898 cast of the Greek classic "Medea" and yearbooks from the turn of the century reveal active choirs, bands, and visual artists. Local, state, regional, and national awards for excellence are the norm for Wildcat arts students. Stability in instruction and leadership is also an important factor in the on-going success of the arts programs here. Our arts faculty have a combined 62 years of teaching arts at GCHS. Following its long history of excellence in the arts, in 2006 GCHS created the Performing and Visual Arts Magnet Program as part of its already vigorous academic offerings. Art Magnet students may take part in extensive experiences in the art emphasis of their choosing and may enroll in strands which include: Band, Choir, Orchestra, Theatre/Dance, and the Visual Arts. Along with expanded course work, the Performing and Visual Arts Magnet Program is designed to create well-rounded students who can successfully compete in the global market by developing the rigor,

discipline, and dedication the arts require. The Performing and Visual Arts magnet Program creates the foundation for GCHS to continue its long and storied history of arts and academic excellence – now and into the future.


El programa de artes en GCHS – pasado, presente, y hacia el futuro
