• Visual & Performing Arts Magnet Program

In this program, talented students study and experience a wide range of arts including theatre, dance, music, voice, sculpture, painting and photography. GCHS offers a breadth, depth and quality of arts classes that is unmatched in Northern Colorado.

• Health Sciences Technology Magnet Program

The Health Science Technology Education magnet program gives students the opportunity to explore health profession careers, experience hands-on skills in the classroom and in a healthcare facility, and take academic courses related to the healthcare professions. Students participate in a student organization, HOSA (Health Occupations Students of America) which introduces students to leadership skills and community service. Classes include Language of Healthcare, Pharmacy Tech, CPR/First Aid, Anatomy and more. Students have the opportunity for healthcare certifications upon successful completion.

• AVID Program

AVID is a program designed to help students – especially those who are academically “in the middle” -- prepare for and succeed in college. Students in AVID are taught academic “survival skills” and college-level entry skills. Students learn how to study, read for content, take notes, and manage time. Students participate in collaborative study groups or tutorials led by tutors and mentors.
