Dear Parents,

Each year, the state of Colorado looks at the performance of our students on state assessments, and gives each school a rating based on an analysis of those scores. These ratings then determine what kind of improvement plan each school will be assigned. Schools may be required to implement a performance plan, improvement plan, priority improvement plan, or turnaround plan. Performance plans require the least amount of change and turnaround plans require the most dramatic strategies for improvement.

Based on the results, our school is required to develop an improvement plan. We have met expectations in some areas including Academic Growth in Reading and Dropout Rates. We **did not** meet our goals in a few areas, though, including Academic Achievement in Reading, Academic Growth in English Language Proficiency (CELAPro) and Disaggregated Graduation Rate for Postsecondary & Workforce Readiness. We are approaching our goals in all other categories. We are in the process of developing a plan to address the areas where we did not meet expectations and will submit a two-year plan to the state by January 15, 2013.
