- 1. Go to fsaid.ed.gov
- 2. Create your I.D. by submitting your email and creating a password and user name that you can remember
- Click the continue button and proceed to answer all the required questions
- 4. After all questions have been completed, check your email for a verification email from fafsa.gov
- After this is done and your FSA I.D. is completed, you need to create a FSA I.D. for your parent/guardian. Yours and your parents FSA I.D. is required to submit your FAFSA.

# Scholarships

**TITLE:** Coca-Cola Scholars

**ELIGIBILITY:** Current high school seniors set to graduate during the 2018-2019 academic school year; must be planning to pursue a degree at an accredited U.S. post-secondary institution; must be U.S. Citizens, U.S. Nationals, U.S. Permanent Residents, Refugees, Asylees, Cuban-Haitian Entrants, or Humanitarian Parolees.

**AMOUNT:** \$20,000 - 150 Awards

**DEADLINE:** October 31, 2018 - 5:00 p.m. EST

MORE INFO: Before applying, you will need your high school transcript; contact info for your guidance counselor and principal; extra-curriculars you've participated in since your freshman year and any leadership positions you've held; a list of any honors and awards you have received since your freshman year.

TITLE: Boettcher Foundation

ELIGIBILITY: Must be a graduating Colorado high school senior who has lived in Colorado for both their junior and senior years of high school; Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States OR Meet the requirements for Colorado Asset and hold legal status in the United States or be a part of or have started the process of applying for DACA (More information about DACA is available on the Boettcher website).

**AMOUNT:** Full tuition and Fees to a variety of accredited, Four-year Colorado universities. Each scholar also receives \$2,800/year for room and board, book allowance, and grants specifically for Boettcher scholars.

DEADLINE: November 1 2018 - 11:59pm

## Scholarships Cont.

TITLE: Dell Scholarship

**ELIGIBILITY:** Must be a part of AVID; planning to pursue a bachelor's degree; demonstrate financial need; earn a minimum of a 2.4 GPA

**AMOUNT:** Varies depending on need, AVG is \$20,000 plus a laptop and textbook credits

**DEADLINE:** December 1, 2018 - 5:00 p.m.

MORE INFO: "While we have a required 2.4 grade point average, Dell Scholars targets low-income, highly motivated students who are better than their numbers indicate and demonstrate the drive to succeed despite personal obstacles."

TITLE: National Merit Scholarship

**ELIGIBILITY:** Must take the PSAT/NMSQT

(10th and 11TH Grade)

MORE INFO: PRESAT/NMSQT (10th and 11th Grade) will be given on October 10th if interested in the SAT or potentially qualifying for the National Merit Scholarship, sign up in the counseling office, cost is 16\$
