Maximizing Meals Time

Setting the Table: Follow directions with critical elements and spatial concepts. Put the fork next to the spoon at your sister's seat.

Conversation: Formulate questions to others, turn-taking, and sharing information.

Silly Sabotage: Create opportunities for your child to initiate conversation. Example: Give your child a huge bowl for cereal, or forget to put milk on the cereal.

Talk about the meal-Describe textures, temperatures, and tastes. (Spicy, salty, sweet, bitter, sour, crunchy, warm, smooth, tart, delicious)

Have each family member tell one event that will happen tomorrow or from their current day. Have everyone ask them questions about it.

Maximize Bedtime Routines

When brushing teeth use spatial concepts- on top, in back, in front, on bottom.

Putting on pajamas: talk about body parts, designs, descriptors, add a song like Hokey Pokey or Head, Shoulders....

Say goodnight to 10 items in your child's room each night.

Review all the great things that happened that day and be thankful. Make predictions about happy things that will happen tomorrow.

Make 1 wish for a loved one together.
