A Message from our Principal

Happy New Year, everybody! And welcome to 2020 Spring semester! It is surprising to me that we are already into the second semester of our school year which only convinces me how fast this second semester will go. I want to ask all our stakeholders—parents, grandparents, aunt, uncles, students, siblings, staff—to make a commitment to success this semester including learning and earning credit toward graduation. To that end, attendance and timeliness will be important.

The second semester is an extremely important semester. Seniors are completing courses for graduation (Saturday, May 23th at 12 noon), state testing and SAT testing occurs and Advanced Placement (AP) testing occurs. Schedules for these testing dates will appear in these newsletters throughout the spring. It is extremely important that the current freshman class shows proficiency in Math and ELA along with earning credit in their ELA and Math classes. We have new Graduation Requirements beginning for the Class of 2021 and they require more than just accumulating credits. Graduates must now show proficiency along with earning credits.



Our average daily attendance rate at GCHS is approximately at or above 87.58%. This is way below our goal of 95%. The major reason students fail or have to repeat classes is poor attendance. This is also true for seniors not graduating! Poor attendance is a life changing event. The lack of a high school diploma limits life's opportunities.

We will uphold our expectation of timeliness this semester. Last semester we had far too many tardies recorded. So, invariably, teachers will be asked to close and lock their doors when the tardy bell rings, and staff will sweep the halls and assign detentions to those not in class. Timeliness is an important skill in the real world, and we will work to help students understand this.

We are still working on our FAFSA. What is FAFSA?

To apply for federal student aid, such as federal grants, work-study, and loans, you need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). FAFSA gives you access to the largest source of financial aid to pay for college or career school. In addition, many states and colleges use the student's FAFSA information to determine his or her eligibility for state and school aid, and some private financial aid providers may use the student's FAFSA information to determine whether the student qualifies for their aid. The Greeley Central Senior team is still helping our families complete this important step. Please reach out to them to make an appointment.

All senior students should have received an email invitation to join our senior class Google classroom which was sent to their school email. Please be sure that you accept the invitation, we will be updating it daily and sending important information this way.

Testing Information - WIDA Testing





My name is Kendra Villarreal. I am super excited to be the Junior Counselor! It is exciting to be looking forward to graduation and accomplishing future goals with the class of 2021!

Currently, we are talking about career plans and ensuring our Juniors have completed the new Graduation Guideline requirements set by the state of Colorado. Students need to achieve scores on tests that show competency in Math and English. Many of our juniors have accomplished this requirement by scoring a 31 on the ASVAB. The next opportunity will be taking the SAT test in April. Students must earn a 500 in Math and a 470 in English to reach this requirement.

To prepare, students can access free SAT preparation activities on khanacademy.org. Test practice books are also available online or at local bookstores.

Flu season is here......

- The CDC recommends that everyone 6 months and older get vaccinated this season.

PARKING ISSUES

Please be aware of where you are parking in each of the parking lots. There have been instances where emergency vehicles have needed to access the school and cars have been illegally parked in the lots, making it impossible for these vehicles to get where they need to be.


With the increased number of illegally parked vehicles this year, from this point on (April 5th, 2019), our School Resource Officers from the Greeley Police Department will be issuing tickets for those cars parked illegally.

STUDENT DROP-OFF

Please drop students off at the West entrance (student parking lot) in the morning for school. This parking lot is designed for a better flow of traffic. The Faculty parking lot (located on the North side of the building) is not designed for high-volume traffic and by trying to drop your student off at the North doors creates a bottle-neck on 15th Street and in the parking lot itself.

The West entrance (student parking lot) creates a safer area for your student to get into the building rather than having them walk across 15th Street in traffic. Thank you for your attention to this as we strive to keep the area safe for not only your student but for you as well

We will be blocking off the Faculty parking lot in the mornings and afternoons to try to eliminate this bottleneck. Please do not stop in the middle of the street (15th Street) to let your students run across traffic. This is not safe and is not legal. Please use the student parking lot for dropping off students.
