A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Here comes winter. Hopefully by the time you read this, the fires are out, the election in complete, we've set our clocks back and we're closer to the end of 2020. It can't come soon enough, right?! We are well into 2nd quarter now and winter is setting in. Because of the cold, we are opening our doors a bit earlier (7:15), still taking the temperatures of our students as they come in, still following all protocols. Students have been great in honoring the expectations



of masks, social distancing and the closed campus at lunch. Give your student a high five for that. As we move deeper into quarter 2, please note how important attendance is both with in-person and remotely. Teachers are covering a lot of ground (curriculum) in a short time. We know these conditions—part time in school and part time out—are not ideal, but our students have adapted and most are doing very well in difficult conditions. Give them a hug for that.

Our second round of parent teacher conferences will be from 4-8 pm on Wednesday,

November 11th. Our attendance was good at the first conference considering everything had to be remote and typically our attendance decreases in November, but WAIT! These conferences are important. Your student will be near the midpoint of the 2nd quarter and these conferences can help prevent failures from happening! Don't assume. Sign up and meet with your teachers and counselors. Great questions to ask:

Is my student on track for graduation? Is he/she showing up on remote days? The number one cause of not being successful in class (or the workforce) is attendance! How can I support my student at home with your class? Is my student eligible for sports? Is my student going to be able to participate in Winter or Spring sports with the grades he/she currently has? Losing credits in these quarters puts students off track for their 4 year graduation and potentially makes them ineligible. For parents of seniors, these are important conversations!

I wish all Wildcat families and students a joyous Thanksgiving in the midst of difficult days. I am certainly grateful and thankful to be the principal of a school with such great family support and student initiative.

STUDENT SCHEDULES AND INFINITE CAMPUS PORTAL

Students should check their schedules on Infinite Campus as this will be the most accurate and up to date schedule available. There is an Infinite Campus mobile app for both students and parents. Instructions will be given out during our fall registration, on our website and also this newsletter (see flyers). You can also obtain the instructions and guide on the District website (www.greeleyschools.org) under the Families menu/Infinite Campus - Parent (or Student).

The apps are easily identified by a capital "S" for the student portal or a capital "P" for the parent portal. Students will login using their school username and their student number (lunch number) as their password. If a student does not know their login information, please see someone in the main office.





Parents who have accessed the parent portal last school year (at a District 6 school) should use the same username as before. This username would have ended with an **_PG** (underscore PG). If you cannot get logged in please call the Main Office at (970) 348-5000 for a password reset.

NOTES FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

It's the Rule...Shots Before School!

Colorado Law requires all students attending Colorado schools and licensed child care to be vaccinated against certain diseases, unless an exemption is filed.

- All Kindergarten students must be up to date with 5 immunizations (MMR, Polio, Dtap, Varicella, Hepatitis B).
- All 6th Grade students must have had an additional Tdap immunization between 5th and 6th grade.

Students who are non-compliant with vaccines will have received a letter home in October and will be required to complete these immunizations prior to early November in order to stay in school.

If you are unsure if your child has their immunizations, contact your school health office to check on their immunization status.

Flu season is right around the corner...

The CDC recommends that everyone 6 months and older get vaccinated this season. Here are some other tips for staying healthy:

- Wash your hands with soap and water frequently during the flu season.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Cover your mouth or tuck it into your elbow when coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid contact with people who are sick. Don't share drinks or utensils with others.
- Stay home with fever over 100.5, chills, head and body aches, or uncontrollable cough. For more information about flu prevention, go to:

ATTENDANCE & SICK STUDENTS

DO NOT SEND YOUR STUDENT TO SCHOOL IF THEY ARE SICK!!!!

If you are waiting for results from a COVID test for **ANY MEMBER OF YOUR HOME, KEEP YOUR STUDENT AT HOME** until you receive verification from your doctor that the test result is negative. If any person in your home receives a positive COVID test all members of your household need to stay home.

We ask you to call at least 1-hour in advance if you wish to pick up your student.

To report an absence for your student please call the attendance line directly at **(970) 348-5014**. If you do not get a live person, please leave a message with the following information: 1.) student's name, 2.) grade level, 3.) date of birth, 4.) reason for the absence/early release, 5) if picking up student, the time the student should be released. **NOTE THAT Due to COVID-19**, parents, guardians, and relatives will be stopped by security at either the West or North entrance. Only those listed on the student's contact information will be able to pick up students. Please note that during testing, field trips, or athletic events, your student may initially be marked absent until later that afternoon. Attendance for some testing or school events is delayed due to receiving final student attendance lists from the testing rooms or field trip chaperones/coaches. We thank you in advance for your understanding.

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SCHOOL IS GOING STRONG!

We are into our second quarter of school for the 20-21 school year. This year, we are using a hybrid bell schedule so not all students will be in the building at the same time. The hybrid bell schedule we will be using follows an AA/BB schedule.

The way this will work will be when Group A is in-person at the school, then Group B will be online off-site. When Group B is in-person at the school, then Group A will be online off-site. On Wednesdays, all students will be online off-site.

- On Mondays & Tuesdays, **Group A** will be in-person and **Group B** will be online off-site.
- On Thursdays & Fridays, **Group B** will be in-person and **Group A** will be online off-site. Groups have been determined by the last name of the student:

There have been a few modifications to our school schedule for the end of December so please take a look at these changes. The second quarter will end on Thursday, December 17th. There will be no school for students or staff the entire week of Thanksgiving, Since we are limited to the number of in-person days for students in November, **PLEASE DO NOT MISS** any days leading up to or days after our Thanksgiving break. 


ATHLETICS/ACTIVITIES WILDCAT SPECTATOR

Welcome to the Greeley Central Athletics/Activities corner. Check out what we have coming up, what we've done, and even archives of some of our highlights from years-past.

Tales from the Archives

From the 1923 SPUD (yearbook), our first set of bleachers at the original District Football Stadium, which was built on the West side of where the Castle currently stands. These bleachers backed up to what is currently 16th Avenue Court (the road just East of the Hospital) and faced East. Fans from the stands had a great view of the small town of Greeley, since the Castle was not yet built at this time. Read a little more of how these bleachers came to be and the little nuggets of history given. A few years later, however, the view looking from the bleachers was the mighty Castle. How we all miss not having the District Stadium next to the Castle. Cheers to old Greeley High!!



GREELEY HIGH SCHOOL BLEACHERS

At last Greeley High School has her own football field, fenced and supplied with the best bleachers of any high school in the state. The interesting and unique thing about the bleachers is that they were built by the manual training classes except the four tiers of cement foundations 12x12 inches and 280 feet long which were put in by Wm. Cooper, contractor.

The work was started September 17, 1922 and was completed October 10. The bleachers are 280 feet long and have a seating capacity of 2500. There were 30,000 feet of lumber used and the total cost was \$1,462.

There were fifteen boys working every school day. The work was very practical because the boys worked a full day at a time. The first period class worked all day Monday then was excused from manual training for the rest of the week and that time used to make up work lost Monday. The second period class worked Tuesday, and so on.

After the bleachers were finished, football goal posts were put in place and ticket booths were built at both entrances to the field.

Welcome to the 2020-21 school year. What a year it has become with CHSAA changing the sports around into 4 seasons. We are currently half-way through the Fall season with boys golf, boys tennis, cross country and softball competing. In the upcoming weeks, off season programs will begin workouts with the hopes of their seasons in the future.

A few things to begin working on as the winter season (boys basketball, girls basketball, and wrestling) approaches on January 4th:

Due to the short turnaround after winter break, we are asking that those students interested in winter sports complete their sports registration ASAP. Registration is now open for Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball, Wrestling, Boys Soccer and Volleyball at Greeley Central.

Stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from other people.



Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash and wash your hands.



When in public, wear a cloth face covering over your nose and mouth.



Do not touch your eyes, nose, and mouth.



Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.



Stay home when you are sick, except to get medical care.



Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
