A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Wildcat Students and their Parents/Guardians,

Happy new year! It feels good to be in a new year, doesn't it? As we look back on this school year, we recognize that our hybrid schedule (3 days structured schooling paired with 2 days of independent learning) will not bridge the gap between a COVID and non-COVID school year. We must utilize this spring semester to begin to work toward all Wildcats being under one roof together—the Castle—when safety protocols allow. Consistent



expectations have been strong structures at Central, and we want to start the second semester with our best foot forward.

Please review the following information together with your family so you can prepare accordingly. **Starting Second Semester (1/6/20):**

- We will continue in a 4 x 4 schedule plus Seminar which means each student is scheduled, on average, four blocks a day and earning 4.0 credits (8 classes) from January through May. (Just like first semester)
 - Full time students (on average) should have 4 classes each quarter.
 - For Spring athletic eligibility, athletes must take a total of at least 5 classes over Q3 and Q4 combined and have passed at least 5 classes in fall semester.
 - Season B will be starting January 18th. Teams are already participating in open gyms.
- Teaching staff will provide authentic lessons **FIVE DAYS A WEEK** for each class.
 - Students will be required to attend classes and engage in their learning five days a week based upon our bell schedule.
 - Each class (Block) will be around 95 minutes on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.
- When in our hybrid/In-person model, Seminar & lunch is combined into a 150 minute block—two lunch times (A or B) to accommodate for lunch in the classroom.
 - Wednesdays will remain 55 minute blocks in the morning with the afternoon's being individual or small group intervention time—Teacher office hours.
 - Every student will be required to "go to school five days a week":
- **AA-orange cohort students** will attend in-person classes on Mondays and Tuesdays.
 - And will remote in (from home) on Wednesday—Friday.

- BB-Black cohort students will attend in-person classes on Thursdays and Fridays.
 - And will remote in (from home) on Mondays—Wednesdays.
- Some online students will continue to work in Edgenuity (allowing for a more flexible daily schedule) as there has been evidence of success in earning credit within core classes from fall semester. However, many students who are in our 100% online program did not earn a qualifying credit in one or more core class(es) in Edgenuity for fall semester. These students, and those accessing specific programs, will have to work doubly hard to stay on track for graduation. This semester is important.

We hope that you had a wonderful winter break with friends and family in a healthy and safe way. And we are looking forward to working with you this second semester.



NOTES FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Flu season is here:

The CDC recommends that everyone 6 months and older get vaccinated this season.

Here are some other tips for staying healthy:

- Wash your hands with soap and water frequently during the flu season.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Cover your mouth or tuck it into your elbow when coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid contact with people who are sick.
 Don't share drinks or utensils with others.
- Stay home with fever over 100.5, chills, head and body aches, or uncontrollable cough.

As we go remote: please help us continue contact tracing:

- Please notify your school's health office if your child becomes ill or receives notification of a positive COVID-19 test during the 48 hours after their last day at school. Voice messages will be monitored during the remote learning period.
- If your child has been out of school on a quarantine, please notify your school's health office if your child becomes ill or receives notification of a positive COVID-19 test at any point during the quarantine period.
- If your child tests positive for COVID-19 at any time during the remote learning period, please notify your school's health office.

Continue to practice recommended guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19:

• Wear a mask when around any person outside of your immediate household. Wear a mask both indoors and outdoors. Anyone 11 years of age and older is mandated to wear a mask in public places; anyone between the ages of 3 and 11 years are strongly advised to wear a mask.

- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for a minimum of 20 seconds scrubbing all surfaces
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash, or use your inner elbow or sleeve
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Stay home if you are sick. Please!
- Get a flu shot! Everyone in the household should be vaccinated against influenza. It is not too late! Flu shots are available through your healthcare provider and at numerous pharmacies throughout the community.
- Clean high touch surfaces in your home and personal items such as cell phones using regular household products
- Practice social distancing, staying at least 6 feet away from others
- Socialize only with those in your household; if you must attend a gathering, limit the number of people to 10 and only from two households.



Tales from the Archives (from the 1981 SPUD)

"Kyger's Krew" loses two in regular season play

During the 1980-81 school year, in his third year as coach of the girls basketball team, Bill Kyger led the Wildcats to a regular season record of 16-2 and the State Class AAA Consolation Championship. The girls lost an early season game to Boulder, 42-41, and a conference game to Rocky Mountain, 51-48, to mar a fantastic season. High among the list of Cat victims were the Arvada Redskins, the eventual Class AAAA State Champions.

Finishing in second place in the conference and the number one AAA seed for the district tournament, the Wildcats swept by Loveland, 47-31, and then were startled by Niwot in the final round of the district meet, 48-47.



Leading the way for the girls throughout the tournament were Patti Slighter and Lynnette Snidow. They were both named to the All-Tournament Team for their outstanding play.

- 4. We currently do not know if fans will be allowed or not under the guidelines. We hope to have an answer in the near future.

SPORTS REGISTRATION

Our winter season (Basketball, Girls Swimming & Wrestling) will start practices on January 18th. The sports that didn't take place this fall - Boys Soccer and Volleyball - will start their seasons March 8th. The traditional spring season (Baseball, Girls Soccer, Boys Swimming, Girls Tennis and Track) will begin on April 26th. If your student plans to participate in a sport, particularly a winter sport, please register right away so there is time to address any issues there may be with their registration. Remember that nobody can try out for basketball if they have not been registered and cleared by the athletic office.

Any student who wishes to participate in sports must register online using the sports registration link above and have an up to date physical as well as insurance. This process takes time so again, do not wait until the last minute and run the risk that your student isn't ready to start practice on day one! PSAT/NMSQT TESTING FOR 10TH GRADERS

We will be holding the PSAT/NMSQT testing on January 26th for 10th graders. More details will be given to those students who register for the test. To register for the test, you must contact your Sophomore Counselor (Mrs. Parsell) or Mr. Reyes by the end of the day on January 20th. Scores are used to determine eligibility and qualification for the National Merit Scholarship. The length of the exam is approximately 3 hours and 30 minutes.

The cost for this test is \$17.00 this year.




