Graduation Requirements (Starting with Class of 2021)

CHECKING OUT STUDENTS / DO NOT DELIVER ITEMS

Parents & Guardians that need to pick up students for appointments MUST CALL AT

LEAST 1 OR 2 HOURS IN ADVANCE. We do not always have someone to run a pass for a student and students may be in other locations in the building for specific events, class exercises, or meetings.

Also, due to COVID, if your student leaves something at home (i.e., Chromebooks, phones, homework, etc.), please DO NOT bring those items to the school as we CANNOT accept items for students.





IN-PERSON LEARNING & MAY SCHEDULE

We are back to our 100% in-person learning schedule for all students who have been using our hybrid learning schedule (those in Group A or Group B)! Please take note of our "no school days" & our adjustments for those weeks that have a modified school week (i.e., the week of May 17th).

Note that on **Wednesday, May 12th**, students will be at home online as normal **EXCEPT** this day will be an Asynchronous Day (no video conferences or zoom meetings). On this day, students should log in to their Schoology for each class and do the assignment posted for that day.

Please note that we won't have our normal Wednesday Remote Online day the week of May 17th due to only having 4 days of school that week PLUS that week is Finals Week.



CHECKING FOR STUDENT FEES

As we get closer to the end of the school year, please start checking to see if your student may still owe any school fees. Although there may be items your student still has checked out (i.e., current season's uniform, current class's textbook, current Library book, etc.), there may be some items that have been posted to your student's fees from a previous quarter or a previous school year. Please check Infinite Campus (either through the Student portal or the Parent portal) to view these outstanding items. To view these items, once logged in to Infinite Campus:

- At the top left of the screen, click the menu icon (see the left red arrow in the picture to the right).
- Click the menu item labeled "**Fees**" (see the red circle in the picture to the right).
 - The default shows all "**Unpaid**" fees. If your student currently has fees due they will show up here.
 - To see what fees have been paid during this school year you can change the "**Type**" at the top right to "**Paid**". To view all fees incurred (paid & unpaid) for this school year, change the "**Type**" at the top right to "**All**".
 - To pay outstanding fees, please utilize the **District 6 Web Store**, which can be located under the main picture of our school website: https://www.GreeleySchools.org/GreeleyCentral

ATHLETICS/ACTIVITIES WILDCAT SPECTATOR


Welcome to the Greeley Central Athletics/Activities corner. Check out what we have coming up, what we've done, and even archives of some of our highlights from years-past. We now spot-light the girls soccer team from 1986-87 as they made their way to the state meet.

Tales from the Archives (from the 1987 SPUD)

First Cat Soccer Team To State Meet

The girls' soccer team left their mark in the Central record books this year by becoming the first Greeley soccer team to reach the state tournament. The trip was made possible by their 3-0 win over the Fort Collins Lambkins in the playoffs, and a more than respectable

9-3-1 overall record.

In the opening round of the state tournament, the kickers faced the Denver Metro League champions, John F. Kennedy High School. JFK dropped the kickers 2-0 to eliminate them from the tournament.

From the beginning of the season, big things were expected from the team, and they lived up to the expectations.

Beginning with three impressive wins over Rocky Mountain (2-0),

Lewis Palmer (7-2), and Poudre (1-0), it appeared that the girls would be contenders. Scoring then became a problem for the girls, resulting in losses to Thornton, Fort Collins and Northglenn. Regaining their scoring form, the girls won five games, four of which were shutouts. The regular season ended with a tie to cross-town rival West. With the 0-0 tie the girls earned their eighth shutout of the season, a school record for girls' soccer.

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When it came to the All-Conference selections, the girls were well-represented, with four girls named to the team. Three of the girls were among the top four vote getter. Mandi Chesley, Julie Welch, Bambi Coonrod and Dawn White were named to the first team, while Mari Salveson was named to the second team.

Home Contest guidelines and expectations:

- Please plan on arriving no earlier than 20 minutes before the start of the event.





NOTES FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Flu season is here:

The CDC recommends that everyone 6 months and older get vaccinated this season.

Here are some other tips for staying healthy:

- Wash your hands with soap and water frequently during the flu season.

- Cover your mouth or tuck it into your elbow when coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid contact with people who are sick.
 Don't share drinks or utensils with others.
- Stay home with fever over 100.5, chills, head and body aches, or uncontrollable cough.

As we begin to bring all students in-person, please help us continue contact tracing:

- Please notify your school's health office if your child becomes ill or receives notification of a positive COVID-19 test during the 48 hours after their last day at school. Voice messages will be monitored during the remote learning period.
- If your child has been out of school on a quarantine, please notify your school's health office if your child becomes ill or receives notification of a positive COVID-19 test at any point during the quarantine period.
- If your child tests positive for COVID-19 at any time during the remote learning period, please notify your school's health office.

Continue to practice recommended guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19:

• Wear a mask when around any person outside of your immediate household. Wear a mask both indoors and outdoors. Anyone 11 years of age and older is mandated to wear a mask in public places; anyone between the ages of 3 and 11 years are strongly advised to wear a mask.

- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for a minimum of 20 seconds scrubbing all surfaces
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash, or use your inner elbow or sleeve
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Stay home if you are sick. Please!
- Get a flu shot! Everyone in the household should be vaccinated against influenza. It is not too late! Flu shots are available through your healthcare provider and at numerous pharmacies throughout the community.
- Clean high touch surfaces in your home and personal items such as cell phones using regular household products
- Practice social distancing, staying at least 6 feet away from others
- Socialize only with those in your household; if you must attend a gathering, limit the number of people to 10 and only from two households.
