SATURDAY SCHOOL/AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING

Does your student need a little extra help with some classes? Does your student need to catch a on a class or two? There are plenty of opportunities to get that extra help. Not only do we have Seminar three days a week, we offer after school tutoring as well as Saturday school.

After school tutoring is held after school (go figure) Tuesdays through Fridays from 3:30pm to 4:45pm. Teachers keep a seating chart as well as attendance for those the take advantage of this opportunity. There are some days where we may need to cancel after school tutoring based upon teacher conflicts, meetings, or other events. We will make announcements to students over the intercom regarding any cancellations there may be.

Saturday school will be held from 8:00am to 11:00am in the GCHS Library and is open to anyone that needs help with their classes or are just needing a quiet place to study. This year, we will be keeping the doors open one hour longer (open until 12:00pm for Juniors and Seniors to catch up on some credits (although we won't kick Sophomores and Freshmen out if they really want to stay). 
ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES - AT LEAST 1 HOUR NOTICE

Please be aware that there are times when the office staff are short-staffed or we do not have staff or students available to send passes to your student when given no notice ahead of time. Most appointments scheduled for your student are setup by you, the parent/guardian, long before the time of the appointment. Please don't wait until the last minute to call in for your student to be released from school.

Your student may be taking an exam in a different classroom than normally scheduled, be in a P.E. class that is on a run around the school or on our practice field, or may be in a meeting with

a counselor, administrator or other staff member. Locating your student in short notice is sometimes impossible to do.

This school year we have seen an overwhelming amount of phone calls for not only attendance issues but early releases for students at the last minute. We ask for your patience as we try to handle your phone calls throughout the day. If your appointment or early release is in the afternoon, please call in the morning so we can prepare a pass for your student and allow us to track down your student throughout the day.



We understand there are emergencies that do occur and we do our best to accommodate for these situations. School ends at 3:30pm EACH DAY so releases AFTER 3:00pm may not be possible. PLEASE PLAN AHEAD!

Also, please use the **WEST STUDENT PARKING LOT** (see map above) to pick up and drop off your student(s). Thank you!



Seniors should have started their college and FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) applications! All students wanting any kind of financial assistance, including scholarships should complete the FAFSA, even if you will not qualify for federal grants. Complete the FSA ID for both the student and a parent at fsaid.ed.gov (This is the secure signature for FAFSA). Complete the FAFSA at student aid.gov.

November 4th is our FAFSA help night from 4-6:30 PM in the GCHS Library. Financial Aid representatives will be here to help. Bring your 2020 tax forms to complete the process on this night. If you have special circumstances that you think might affect your application, we have help for that too!

Tales from the Archives (from the 1928, 1939 & 1948 SPUD)

LIBRARY


From the 1939 Spud, "The Library is the high school student's best friend. For his leisure hours he finds companions in books, while for study he finds reference material always at hand. Miss Mott, the librarian, is always there, ready to help."

If you notice from the photo below, this is a photo from what is now our current Historic Library Lab in room 215. You can see the same built-in bookshelves that still exist along the wall and the architecture of the room, which was not changed, other than blocking off the large doorway under the wall clock shown in the photo.



CLOCKS IN THE CASTLE - 1948

Taking a look back at the Castle, here's an oldie but a goodie. From the 1947-48 SPUD (our school's yearbook), looking South on the 3rd floor you can see the old clock hanging down from the ceiling. These clocks are no longer hanging from the ceilings in the Castle but with the clocks in the hallways you could rest assured that no student was late for class while these clocks were hanging up in the Castle...well, maybe they were late!

AUDITORIUM - 1928


From the 1928 Spud, a look at the old auditorium as you were standing in the West parking lot. If you took this same picture today, you would be standing in the courtyard. Look at the ornate windows and the wooden doors as you would look at the auditorium. These doors were actually used as exit doors as the entrance to the auditorium was through the 1st floor hallway.

Also, in the picture to the right, you can see the balcony of the back of the auditorium through the windows. Through the years, these windows were covered up as too much light came through and the dark heavy curtains were no match for the sunlight.


The photo on the bottom left is the view of the auditorium balcony from the stage.

The photo on the bottom right is a view of the auditorium stage.

With the remodel in 2000, the balcony would become the floor of the new Library and



would extend all the way to the stage. In the new Library, you can see the original top of the stage, which now sits right above the circulation desk. The architectural beams were kept throughout the ceiling of the Library. The windows were revitalized and the black coverings removed from the upper sections of the windows. What a marvelous work of art! This is why we respect the Castle.













I-Matter connects kids to free mental health sessions.

- Anyone between 12 and 18 can go to the I Matter state website to take a short survey to assess their needs. If the results show they need help, the site will connect them to a provider for a 45-minute appointment in the next two weeks. One of the early questions asks if the young person is in crisis and directs those who answer yes to a crisis line and a more rapid response.
- Children under 12 can also use the service but need a parent to do so, and young adults who are receiving special education services can access the free help up to age 21.

- Your School Health Clerk is **Tina Alvarez** and your Registered Nurse is Caryn **Ishmael**. The Health Office phone number is 970.348.5026.
- Your health clerk is at school daily between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. They are responsible for entering immunization and hearing/vision screening data, providing first aid and comfort care for students as well as administering medications and procedures to students once trained and delegated by the School Registered Nurse.
- The School Registered Nurse is responsible for training staff on care of students with health or medical concerns, writing health care plans for students with health needs, and obtaining health histories for students with IEPs. The RN is available during school

hours for consultation on student health concerns by health clerks and school staff. The School RN also participates on Special Education, Wellness, Mental Health and Crisis teams, and may assist teachers with health related topic education.

- Stay home when you are sick. When exhibiting illness symptoms such as fever over 100.0, chills, head and body aches, or uncontrollable cough- stay home to prevent others from catching your illness! It is also important to avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Germs spread this way. Don't share drinks or utensils with others.
- **Cover coughs and sneezes.** Use a tissue to cover coughs and sneezes, then dispose of the tissue. When a tissue is not available, cough or sneeze into your elbow.
- Wash hands for 20 seconds with soap and warm water. If you cannot wash your hands, use alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces or objects.

 Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill.
- **Consult your primary care provider** with any symptoms of significant illness.

Vision/Hearing Screening:

- Vision problems in students are common and can impair development. If a student can't see, they have trouble learning and vision problems can lead to permanent vision loss, early detection and treatment is important.
- We recently completed Vision and Hearing screenings for your student at school. If you received a Vision Referral Letter for your student in the mail, this means that your student did not pass the screening and needs further vision follow-up with a vision professional. Please contact the health office with any questions/concerns.
