

If your senior has not yet applied for the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), they should do so ASAP. Scholarship applications have begun opening in January, and many will not process applications if the FAFSA isn't complete. Go to

www.fafsa.ed.gov. You will need tax returns for you and your senior (if applicable). There will be help available this months nd next to help with the process.

Soon students will begin to register for classes next year. This is an important process for staffing–I will make many decisions around number of courses based on student



selections; therefore, it is important that students choose wisely. Oftentimes it helps for the student to discuss their choices with their parents and receive feedback since their parents know them best. We cannot allow for a lot of schedule changes in the Fall.

We continue to make after-school tutoring available to all students Tuesday–Friday each week and soon we will begin hosting Saturday school (8:00am-11:00am). If your student is behind in a class or has missed a lot of school, these are great opportunities to catch up.

The 7 Period Modified Block Schedule is below. Mondays will have all 7 classes but a later start time. We will have a block schedule with an "Odd Day - BLACK DAY" on Wednesdays & Fridays (Blocks 1,3,5,7) and an "Even Day - ORANGE DAY" on Tuesdays & Thursdays (Blocks 2,4,6, Seminar). These classes are 95 minutes long. There will be a required Seminar class on Tuesdays & Thursdays. School staff will develop and communicate expectations regarding this time to all students at the beginning of each school year. Daily announcements may occur during block 4 each day (or the block PRIOR to lunch).

ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES - AT ${f LEAST}$ 1 HOUR NOTICE

Please be aware that there are times when the office staff are short-staffed or we do not have staff or students available to send passes to your student when given no notice ahead of time. Most appointments scheduled for your student are setup by you, the parent/guardian, long before the time of the appointment. Please don't wait until the last minute to call in for your student to be released from school.

Your student may be taking an exam in a different classroom than normally scheduled, be in a P.E. class that is on a run around the school or on our practice field, or may be in a meeting with


a counselor, administrator or other staff member. Locating your student in short notice is sometimes impossible to do.

This school year we have seen an overwhelming amount of phone calls for not only attendance issues but early releases for students at the last minute. We ask for your patience as we try to handle your phone calls throughout the day. If your appointment or early release is in the afternoon, please call in the morning so we can prepare a pass for your student and allow us to track down your student throughout the day.

We understand there are emergencies that do

occur and we do our best to accommodate for these situations. School ends at 3:30pm EACH DAY so releases AFTER 3:00pm may not be possible. PLEASE PLAN AHEAD!

THESPIAN TROUPE 657

From the 1946 Spud:

"Troupe 657 of the National Thespian Society was newly organized in Greeley High this year. Members of this organization have worked on some phases of the dramatic production of GHS. The initial installation services were held February 4 [1946]. A lovely reception followed with the new officers forming the reception line. Thespians, under the sponsorship of Mrs. Grace Dawson, presented "Cradle Song" as their first production Jan. 10 and 12, in the Greeley High auditorium before appreciative audiences."

The tradition of putting on great performances by our Thespian Troupe 657 continues to this day here at Greeley Central High School. Don't forget to catch the Spring musical in March. - Anyone between 12 and 18 can go to the I Matter state website to take a short survey to assess their needs. If the results show they need help, the site will connect them to a provider for a 45-minute appointment in the next two weeks. One of the early questions asks if the young person is in crisis and directs those who answer yes to a crisis line and a more rapid response.
- Children under 12 can also use the service but need a parent to do so, and young adults who are receiving special education services can access the free help up to age 21.

Parents & guardians should remember that even though ALL students will not have to pay for breakfast or lunch this school year (all students eat for free), your student may also qualify to have their sports participation fees or AP Testing fees waive. Once you provide a copy of this letter to the GCHS Finance Office (Nancy Kern), your student(s) will be exempt from athletic participation fees (\$75 per student per sport) and a reduced AP Testing Fee (typically reduced to \$15 per test instead of \$94 per test).

Loss of sense of taste or smell for any period Meet your School Registered Nurse and Health Clerk. Welcome to the Health Office!

- Your School Health Clerk is Tina Alvarez and your Registered Nurse is Caryn **Ishmael**. The Health Office phone number is 970.348.5026.
- Your health clerk is at school daily between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. They are responsible for entering immunization and hearing/vision screening data, providing first aid and comfort care for students as well as administering medications and procedures to students once trained and delegated by the School Registered Nurse.
- The School Registered Nurse is responsible for training staff on care of students with health or medical concerns, writing health care plans for students with health needs, and obtaining health histories for students with IEPs. The RN is available during school

hours for consultation on student health concerns by health clerks and school staff. The School RN also participates on Special Education, Wellness, Mental Health and Crisis teams, and may assist teachers with health related topic education.

- Health is an important part of every student's education. We are here to support your child's health care needs and help them stay healthy, safe, and present in school so that they are ready to learn!
- If your student has a health concern, your student is ill, or if you need resources for health care providers, the Health Office team can help! Give us a call!

From the Health Office - Preventing the Spread of Illness During the COVID-19 Pandemic:

- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is responding to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by COVID – 19. This disease is one type of Coronavirus, a virus that causes many flulike symptoms.

To stay healthy, the National Association of School Nurses endorses the CDC recommendations below:

- **Get your flu shot!** The flu vaccine is recommended by the CDC for everyone 6 months and older.
- Stay home when you are sick. When exhibiting illness symptoms such as fever over 100.0, chills, head and body aches, or uncontrollable cough- stay home to prevent others from catching your illness! It is also important to avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Germs spread this way. Don't share drinks or utensils with others.
- **Cover coughs and sneezes.** Use a tissue to cover coughs and sneezes, then dispose of the tissue. When a tissue is not available, cough or sneeze into your elbow.
- Wash hands for 20 seconds with soap and warm water. If you cannot wash your hands, use alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces or objects.
 Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill.
- **Consult your primary care provider** with any symptoms of significant illness.

Vision/Hearing Screening:

- Vision problems in students are common and can impair development. If a student can't see, they have trouble learning and vision problems can lead to permanent vision loss, early detection and treatment is important.
- We recently completed Vision and Hearing screenings for your student at school. If you received a Vision Referral Letter for your student in the mail, this means that your student did not pass the screening and needs further vision follow-up with a vision professional. Please contact the health office with any questions/concerns.


HOSA FUNDRAISER



CHECKING FOR STUDENT FEES
