The month of April is a testing month, not only for us at Central, but for the District and the State. I am always very appreciative at how serious our students approach these assessments. Juniors will be taking the SAT test – a test important for Central's school performance framework and important to students' college opportunities. We are expecting all our Freshmen, Sophomores and Juniors to show up Wednesday, April 13th to take these College Board exams. They will have the afternoon free after offering us their best efforts in the morning (see page 6 & 7 for more information). Thank you parents for helping us emphasize the importance of these assessments. We use the data from these assessments to help us determine skill level and proper placement of students going forward.

Summer school will be around the corner and we will be expecting quite a few students who need to make up credit. One fallout from COVID is that its created an increased number of students who are behind in credit. Summer School is open to any Greeley Central student but especially to those needing to stay on tack for graduation. It will begin the week of Memorial Day–May 31st–and run four weeks through June 23rd and will meet from 8-12 Monday through Thursday each week.

Seniors, the year is drawing to a close quickly. Lots will be happening–Senior Picture, Senior practice, barbeque, meeting and sunset, not to mention grad parties with family and friends. Exciting times. Please be in class; please complete necessary work to earn necessary credit.



TESTING IN APRIL

In April we will be holding some of our standardized testing for 9th, 10th and 11th grade students. The week of April 4th, all 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students were given a Student Guide for PSAT/SAT. This guide provides valuable information about the PSAT/SAT as well as tips on how to prepare for the test. Here's what we have coming up:

9th, 10th, & 11th GRADE STUDENTS

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 13TH (THE PSAT/SAT TEST)

Greeley Central's annual PSAT/SAT assessment will take place on Wednesday, April 13th, here at Greeley Central. On this day, **only students testing (9th, 10th, and 11th)** will be here at the school, in-person. All other students should stay home since teachers will be helping with testing.

What is your role as a parent/guardian?

- Your student should check into their testing room no later than 8:00 a.m. If your student is late, their may not be allowed into the testing room and could be sent home.
- Breakfast is extremely important on this day. Please make sure your student eats breakfast the day of testing.
 - Students who traditionally eat breakfast at school will still be served breakfast.
 - Lunch will also be provided for students who typically eat lunch at school.
- Please make sure that your child gets a good night of sleep. They need to be well-rested so that they can focus.
- If possible, your student should come to school with a 4-function calculator. Although calculators are not needed to complete the test, a calculator may be used on one of the math sections. Calculators cannot be shared among students during the testing session.

Normal classes will not be held after PSAT/SAT testing on April 13th so once students complete their test, they are free to leave. If possible, students can be picked up after testing is completed, but if unable to be picked up, buses will run at their normal time.

11th GRADE STUDENTS

TUESDAY or WEDNESDAY, APRIL 19th or 20th (THE CMAS TEST)

Junior students will take the annual CMAS assessment in Science only. Your child will test on April 19th or 20th. CMAS Science assessments are 50 minutes each and will be completed within a morning or afternoon session, depending on which time your child is assigned. There are 3 separate Science assessments.

Please encourage your student to try his/her best; it is an opportunity to show what they have learned and know based on instruction over the past year here at Greeley Central. We are eager to see their growth!

We would ask that you refrain from making any appointments or pulling your student out of school on April 13th (PSAT/SAT) and April 19th/20th so that your child doesn't have to participate in make-up sessions that could take time away from their daily class schedule.

ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES - AT ${f LEAST}$ 1 HOUR NOTICE

Please be aware that there are times when the office staff are short-staffed or we do not have staff or students available to send passes to your student when given no notice ahead of time. Most appointments scheduled for your student are setup by you, the parent/guardian, long before the time of the appointment. Please don't wait until the last minute to call in for your student to be released from school.

Your student may be taking an exam in a different classroom than normally scheduled, be in a P.E. class that is on a run around the school or on our practice field, or may be in a meeting with


a counselor, administrator or other staff member. Locating your student in short notice is sometimes impossible to do.

This school year we have seen an overwhelming amount of phone calls for not only attendance issues but early releases for students at the last minute. We ask for your patience as we try to handle your phone calls throughout the day. If your appointment or early release is in the afternoon, please call in the morning so we can prepare a pass for your student and allow us to track down your student throughout the day.

We understand there are emergencies that do

occur and we do our best to accommodate for these situations. School ends at 3:30pm EACH DAY so releases AFTER 3:00pm may not be possible. PLEASE PLAN AHEAD!



Are interested in being prepared for life after high school? Do you want to go to college but are unsure how to get there? Are you looking for a group of peers and a teacher to support you throughout your high school career?

If so, We want you to join our AVID FAMILY!

What is AVID?

AVID, which stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination, is a program dedicated to helping students achieve their goal of college graduation. The AVID class is held within the regular school day and provides academic monitoring, academic and organizational assistance, and teambuilding. It also encourages students to answer higher-level thinking questions and develop college-level writing skills. Weekly, students lead and participate in tutorial groups in the AVID classroom to resolve areas of confusion and gain a better understanding of current content. In addition, students are taught study skills, test preparation, time management, and the writing process.

This class will teach you study skills, test prep, time management, and college-level writing skills, helping you be successful in high school today and college in the future.

Who is right for AVID?

AVID targets bright students who might be under-achieving, students underrepresented in the college system, or first-generation college students. However, any student determined to attend college who wants assistance preparing for college should apply. The most important factor is INDIVIDUAL DETERMINATION- a willingness to try and the grit to persevere.

Benefits of AVID

- Academic support

- Anyone between 12 and 18 can go to the I Matter state website to take a short survey to assess their needs. If the results show they need help, the site will connect them to a provider for a 45-minute appointment in the next two weeks. One of the early questions asks if the young person is in crisis and directs those who answer yes to a crisis line and a more rapid response.
- Children under 12 can also use the service but need a parent to do so, and young adults who are receiving special education services can access the free help up to age 21.

FREE & REDUCED LUNCHES

Parents & guardians should remember that even though ALL students will not have to pay for breakfast or lunch this school year (all students eat for free), your student may also qualify to have their sports participation fees or AP Testing fees waive. BUT IF YOU DO NOT SUBMIT THE FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH APPLICATION, your student will be responsible for the full payment of these fees.

Weld County School District 6 suggests that you complete the Free and Reduced Lunch application for your family. If you qualify, you will receive a letter via email stating your application status. Once you provide a copy of this letter to the GCHS Finance Office (Nancy Kern), your student(s) will be exempt from athletic participation fees (\$75 per student per sport) and a reduced AP Testing Fee (typically reduced to \$15 per test instead of \$94 per test).

If this letter is NOT provided, you will be responsible for the full fee amounts.

- Your School Health Clerk is **Tina Alvarez** and your Registered Nurse is Caryn **Ishmael**. The Health Office phone number is 970.348.5026.
- Your health clerk is at school daily between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. They are responsible for entering immunization and hearing/vision screening data, providing first aid and comfort care for students as well as administering medications and procedures to students once trained and delegated by the School Registered Nurse.
- The School Registered Nurse is responsible for training staff on care of students with health or medical concerns, writing health care plans for students with health needs, and obtaining health histories for students with IEPs. The RN is available during school

hours for consultation on student health concerns by health clerks and school staff. The School RN also participates on Special Education, Wellness, Mental Health and Crisis teams, and may assist teachers with health related topic education.

- Health is an important part of every student's education. We are here to support your child's health care needs and help them stay healthy, safe, and present in school so that they are ready to learn!
- If your student has a health concern, your student is ill, or if you need resources for health care providers, the Health Office team can help! Give us a call!

From the Health Office - Preventing the Spread of Illness During the COVID-19 Pandemic:

- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is responding to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by COVID – 19. This disease is one type of Coronavirus, a virus that causes many flulike symptoms.

To stay healthy, the National Association of School Nurses endorses the CDC recommendations below:

- **Get your flu shot!** The flu vaccine is recommended by the CDC for everyone 6 months and older.
- Stay home when you are sick. When exhibiting illness symptoms such as fever over 100.0, chills, head and body aches, or uncontrollable cough- stay home to prevent others from catching your illness! It is also important to avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Germs spread this way. Don't share drinks or utensils with others.
- **Cover coughs and sneezes.** Use a tissue to cover coughs and sneezes, then dispose of the tissue. When a tissue is not available, cough or sneeze into your elbow.
- Wash hands for 20 seconds with soap and warm water. If you cannot wash your hands, use alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces or objects.

 Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill.
- **Consult your primary care provider** with any symptoms of significant illness.

Vision/Hearing Screening:

- Vision problems in students are common and can impair development. If a student can't see, they have trouble learning and vision problems can lead to permanent vision loss, early detection and treatment is important.
- We recently completed Vision and Hearing screenings for your student at school. If you received a Vision Referral Letter for your student in the mail, this means that your student did not pass the screening and needs further vision follow-up with a vision professional. Please contact the health office with any questions/concerns.



CHECKING FOR STUDENT FEES





















MORP ON APRIL 9TH, 2022
