GE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Students and Families,

We have seemingly breezed through January but not without struggle and strain. It has been super cold and snowy. Our average daily attendance is down a bit. We'd ask that you continue to insure that your student(s) arrive to school on time and stay at school. Click here for tardy policy.

We will be holding Parent/Teacher conferences on February 16th from 4:30-7:30pm. This will provide an opportunity to check in with your student's

teachers. Conferences will be held in teacher rooms that evening. Enter using the West Entry to pick up

report cards, teacher locations, and other information. If your senior has not yet applied for the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), they should do so

ASAP. Scholarship applications have begun opening in January, and many will not process applications if the FAFSA isn't complete. Go to https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa. You will need tax returns for you and your senior (if applicable). There will be help available this month (February 23rd) and next month to help with the process.

Students will begin registering their 2023-24 classes next week (February 7th). We have made a video available to all families that discusses our course offerings; we have done a walk-about in our gym for students to ask questions; and we have created a slide deck to view. This is an important process for staffing - I will make many decisions around number of courses based on student selections; therefore, it is important that students choose wisely. Oftentimes it helps for the student to discuss their choices with their parents/guardians and receive feedback since their parents/guardians know them best. We cannot allow for a lot of schedule changes in the Fall.

We continue to make after-school tutoring available to all students Tuesday - Friday each week and have began hosting Saturday school from 8:00am-11:00am on specific Saturdays (click here for dates). If your student is behind in a class or has missed a lot of school, these are great opportunities to catch up.

TARDY POLICY FOR SEMESTER 2

In an effort to get students to class in a timely manner and attend their classes, GCHS has implemented a new tardy policy which **began on Tuesday**, **January 17th**. If a student receives more than three tardies or unexcused absences in a single week, they will receive a detention for each tardy after the first three and 2 detentions for each unexcused absence. Examples:

- If a student is tardy to 4 class periods with 0 unexcused absences they will receive one detention
- If a student has 5 unexcused absences they will receive 4 detentions because 5-3=2 and they receive 2 detentions for unexcused absences.
- If a student has 2 tardies and 2 unexcused absences they would receive 2 detentions because 4.3= 1 and unexcused absences receive 2 detentions.

Tardies and unexcused absences will be pulled weekly on Fridays after school and students will receive their detentions to serve the following week. Students that are habitually tardy or absent will receive greater consequences leading up to suspension.


RIT WEEK: FEB 6-10

SPORTS REGISTRATION

Spring sports registration opened on Monday, January 16th. See our homepage for the registration link (or click this link for our sports registration information). Spring sports include: Baseball, Track, Girls Soccer, Boys Volleyball, Girls Tennis.

Boys Volleyball practices begin February 20th. All other spring sports begin February 27th.

Please note the weekly eligibility guidelines:

- 1. Students in grades 9-12 are required to meet the eligibility standards set by the Colorado High School Activities Association (CHSAA) of passing at least five (5) academic classes in the semester prior to participation begins, when the co-curricular activity is one which is governed by CHSAA.
- Weekly eliqibility is done throughout the school year & will be the determining factor for FULL participation in an activity each week. Grades will be pulled on Thursdays & students informed of their status. Students will have until 3:00pm on the following Monday (or other specific time given by the Athletic/Activities Office) to address failing grades for eligibility purposes. The following are the weekly high school eligibility requirements:
 - All students must be enrolled in a minimum of 5 full-time classes. A student enrolled in only 5 classes must be passing (D or better) ALL classes.
 - A student enrolled in more than 5 classes may be failing 1 course & still be eligible to participate (i.e., enrolled in 6, fail 1; enrolled in 7, fail one; enrolled in 8, fail 1).
 - A student enrolled in more than 5 classes becomes INELIGIBLE if they fail 2 or more classes (i.e., enrolled in 6, fail 2 or more; enrolled in 7, fail 2 or more; enrolled in 8, fail 2 or more).






ALL OF FAME INDUCTEES: CLASS **OF 2023**







FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Meet your School Registered Nurse and Health Clerk. Welcome to the Health Office!

- Your School Health Clerk is **Tina Alvarez**and your Registered Nurse is **Caryn Ishmael**. The Health Office phone number is 970.348.5026.
- Your health clerk is at school daily between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. They are responsible for entering immunization and hearing/vision screening data, providing first aid and comfort care for students as well as administering medications and procedures to students once trained and delegated by the School Registered Nurse.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

"It's the Rule! Shots Before School!

- Colorado Law requires all students attending Colorado schools and licensed child care to be vaccinated against certain diseases, unless an exemption is filed.
- All 6th Grade students must have had an additional TDap immunization between 5th and 6th grade.
- Students who are non-compliant with vaccines received a letter in early October and will be required to complete these immunizations prior to early November in order to stay in school.
- If you are unsure if your child has their immunizations, contact your school health office at 970.348.5026 to check on their immunization status.

FLU SEASON IS HERE... LET'S PREVENT THE SPREAD OF ILLNESS - TOGETHER!

Here are some tips for staying healthy and preventing the spread of illnesses:

- **Get your flu shot!** The flu vaccine is recommended by the CDC for everyone 6 months and older.
- **Stay home when you are sick.** When exhibiting illness symptoms such as fever over 100.4, chills, head and body aches, or uncontrollable cough- stay home to prevent others from catching your illness! It is also important to avoid

close contact with people who are sick. Your child must be fever free without medications and no longer presenting with vomiting & diarrhea for at least 24 hours to attend school.

- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Germs spread this way. Don't share drinks or utensils with others.
- **Cover coughs and sneezes.** Use a tissue to cover coughs and sneezes, then dispose of the tissue. When a tissue is not available, cough or sneeze into your elbow.
- Wash hands for 20 seconds with soap and warm water. If you cannot wash your hands, use alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces or objects.
 Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill.
- Consult your primary care provider with any symptoms of significant illness. The doctor will speak with you about possible treatment options. Provide a doctor's note to the school if your child will be absent due to illness.

STUDENT SCHEDULES AND INFINITE CAMPUS PORTAL

Students should check their Semester 2 schedules on Infinite Campus as this will be the most accurate and up to date schedule available. There is an Infinite Campus mobile app for both students and parents. Instructions will be given out during our fall registration, on our website and also this newsletter (see flyers). You can also obtain the instructions and guide on the District website (www.greeleyschools.org) under the Families

menu/Infinite Campus - Parent (or Student) (or click these links - **English** / **Spanish**).

The apps are easily identified by a capital "S" for the student portal or a capital "P" for the parent portal. Students will login using their school username and their student number (lunch number) as their password. If a student does not know their login information, please see someone in the main office.






Parents who have accessed the parent portal last school year (at a District 6 school) should use the same username as before. This username would have ended with an **_PG** (underscore PG). If you cannot get logged in please call the Main Office at (970) 348-5000 for a password reset.

CHECKING FOR STUDENT FEES

As semester 2 begins, please start checking to see if your student may owe any school fees (ESPECIALLY IF YOU ARE EXPECTING TO GRADUATE).

Although there may be items your student still has checked out (i.e., current season's uniform, current class's textbook, current Library book, etc.), there may be some items that have been posted to your student's fees from a previous semester or a previous school year. Please check Infinite Campus (either through the Student portal or the Parent portal) to view these outstanding items. To view these items, once logged in to Infinite Campus:

- At the top left of the screen, click the menu icon (see the left red arrow in the picture to the right).
- Click the menu item labeled "**Fees**" (see the red circle in the picture to the right).
 - The default shows all "**Unpaid**" fees. If your student currently has fees due they will show up here.
 - To see what fees have been paid during this school year you can change the "Type" at the top right to "Paid". To view all fees incurred (paid & unpaid) for this school year, change the "Type" at the top right to "All".
- To pay outstanding fees, please utilize the **District 6 Web Store**, which can be located under the main picture of our school website: https://www.GreeleySchools.org/GreeleyCentral







FREE & REDUCED LUNCHES

If you haven't yet had a chance to complete a Free & Reduced Lunch application, we encourage you to do so. Our Board of Education voted to fund free meals for all students for the 22-23 school year, but in order to get the free meals for your student(s), an application must be completed. If you won't qualify, or don't think



you'll qualify, as long as you complete the application your student will be able to eat meals for free at the school.

If you do qualify, you will receive a letter via email stating your application status. Once you provide a copy of this letter to the GCHS Finance Office (Nancy Kern), your student(s) will be exempt from athletic participation fees (\$75 per student per sport). If this letter is NOT provided, you will be responsible for the full fee amounts.



ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES - AT LEAST 1 or 2 HOURS NOTICE

Please be aware that there are times when the office staff are short-staffed or we do not have staff or students available to send passes to your student when given no notice ahead of time. Most appointments scheduled for your student are setup by you, the parent/guardian, long before the time of the appointment. Please don't wait until the last minute to call in for your student to be released from school.

Your student may be taking an exam in a different classroom than normally scheduled, be in a P.E. class that is on a run around the school or on our practice field, or may be in a meeting with a counselor, administrator or other staff member.



Locating your student in short notice is sometimes impossible to do.

This school year we have seen an overwhelming amount of phone calls for not only attendance issues but early releases for students at the last minute. We ask for your patience as we try to handle your phone calls throughout the day. If your appointment or early release is in the afternoon, please call in the morning so we can prepare a pass for your student and allow us to track down your student throughout the day.

We understand there are emergencies that do occur and we do our best to accommodate for these situations. School ends at 3:40pm EACH DAY so releases AFTER 3:00pm may not be possible. PLEASE PLAN AHEAD!
