Response to Behaviors

Greeley-Evans School District 6 developed a level system to help identify and provide appropriate interventions to address student misconduct. While every attempt will be made to maximize the time that students are engaged in the learning process, schools should select interventions that support students and maintain an orderly and safe learning environment.

Discipline of students with disabilities: Schools should review and be familiar with the district's policies before undertaking discipline of students with disabilities (IEP or 504 plans). For additional guidance please contact the Office of Special Education (970) 348-6103.

Title IX: If the incident has any indication of sexual harassment (see policy AC-R2 for specific definitions) or discrimination/harassment against athletes, SOGI (Sexual Orientation and gender identity) or student who are pregnant, call your Title IX Coordinator before moving forward with disciplinary actions (970) 348-6104. PK-2 Suspensions/Expulsions: Suspensions for students in PK-2 and expulsions for students 12 and under need to include Assistant Superintendent in the conversations, and document alternative behavioral and disciplinary interventions (<u>BOE policy JKD/JKE</u>).

Effective school discipline policies and practices are critical to promoting students' successful learning and well-being. They strengthen students' behavioral skills by addressing the causes of their misbehaviors while preserving the integrity of the learning environment, ensuring the safety and dignity of all students and staff, and fostering progress toward long-term learning and behavioral goals. This framework is based on evidenced based tools to utilize Restorative, Reflective, and Instructional practices for meaningful behavior change.

LEVEL 1 - Level 1 violations will generally be addressed by the staff member supervising the student when the violation occurs and ideally in the space (hallway, classroom, lunchroom, playground) where the behavior occurred. The staff member's response should **teach the correct, alternative behavior** so that the student can learn from their mistake and demonstrate safe and respectful behaviors in the future. Staff members are expected to use a variety of teaching and management strategies which may include:

Questions	Answers
Who should interpret/translate discipline to parents/guardians when their language is non-English?	Utilize Language Links or other resources regularly used for Conferences of Office Visits. If in person, remind them of confidentiality rules. Students should not be utilized in this situation.
What do we do when parents refuse restorative practices/Alt to suspension?	Suspend as appropriate. See if mediation is more of an option?
What about progressive discipline? 1st vs 2nd vs 3rd offense	We are not using the term 3-Strikes and you're out. The columns on the charts on this document do not imply how many times the incident has occurred.
Should we include the LEVEL in IC so we can see what was last assigned?	This is now included in IC behavior management.
Does staff include office staff, instructional assistants, and custodians? How can they access IC to make a referral?	They all should be oriented and familiar with this document. How classified staff enter the data may differ from school to school.
How can we code to see if staff or students are the target?	In IC, when a behavior incident is recorded, we need to identify all students involved, and then identify them as offender(s), participant(s),

	victim(s), witness(es).
Do we differentiate LEVELS based on age?	Yes in practice, but the document doesn't provide that differentiation intentionally.
What is our definition of <u>continual</u> defiance? i.e. how many times?	Board policy and others refer to three times, but at the same time, you need to consider the time frame of those infractions.
Will School Resource Officers be trained in this?	No, School Resource Officers have general knowledge of school discipline. However, they should not be involved in school discipline outside of criminal incidents. There is state legislation against SRO's working as an agent for the school.
Will Campus Monitors be trained in this?	They can be given general knowledge, however it needs to be clear, only school administrators can provide discipline, or search property, etc.
